The university is reminding those who enjoy the South Campus property to please respect the posted signs on the premises, in particular regarding keeping dogs on leash. The signs indicate:

- Do not remove any plants or crops at any time.
- Remain on the trails and grass pathways only.
- Ensure dogs are on their leash at all times.


South Campus contains research lands and restricted areas which off-leash dogs and public vehicle access are **not** permitted. Campus Protective Services will patrol the premises regularly.

In addition, over the last three weeks, there have been a few coyote sightings and issues with coyotes attacking pets that are running freely (off-leash dogs and potentially cats). The U of A also received a complaint from the City of Edmonton Councillor's office that a neighbour's dog (small dog on-leash) was attacked by two large, off-leash dogs on Sector 13 last week. For everyone's safety, please keep all dogs on their leash.

We enjoy sharing the South Campus lands with our neighbours. We hope everyone continues to respect and adhere to the signs in place. Thank you for your cooperation.
