August 22: Community Campout

- Community fire pit with hot dogs, marshmallows & each family bringing a snack (25\$ per family to spend the night). Permit required from City for sleeping in parkland.
- 14 families spent the night, but many more came for campfire & visiting
- Lantern craft and parade through the nature centre for the kids
- Volunteers were helpful for set-up (2), cleaning up after craft time and dinner (2), as well as breakfast in the morning (3)
- Good feedback from all participants very relaxed event.

- 30 participants did a3 km walk or 5 km run/bike (no fee to participate)
