HELP SNOW SHOVELING: NOMINATE A SNOW ANGEL!

If you have a snow shovel and you can help out a senior this winter, you can join the ranks of Edmonton's snow angels. "For some seniors, moving snow is an impossible task so they need help - they need a snow angel," said Councilor Linda Sloan. "Whether you are helping these seniors once or you're shoveling their snow all winter, you're making a difference in their lives." Be-



coming a snow angel is easy. All you need to do is take a senior's sidewalk for the winter or watch for people in your neighbourhood that could use help removing snow. Snow Angels is a sponsored by the City of Edmonton and supported by the Edmonton Seniors Coordinating Council. It helps seniors recognize people who shovel their sidewalks. Under the program, a senior sends the name of someone who has cleared their sidewalks to the Community Services department. The person is then named a snow angel, receives a letter and pin from the mayor and is entered to win prizes in the spring. A Letter From Bryan Anderson...

Individual citizens are really only concerned about how much more they pay for City services. However, when a headline in the Journal reads "Council raises Property Taxes 7.3% for 2009" the citizen assumes that property taxes (PT) are going up 7.3% and utility fee increases are on top of that.

I'm going to give you a brief explanation of the 2009 property tax adjustments:

- In 2008 waste collection management was funded by a monthly fee (\$15.19) and property taxes (\$28M)
- The interim 2009 property tax increase is 7.3%
- The \$14M residential portion of PT's previously used for waste management is being removed from the residential PT base (equal to 3.7%)
- A \$14M non-residential portion (industrial/commercial) of the PT base is being used to provide a rebate to residential property owners for 2009 only (equal to 3.7% on average).
- The average house (assessed at \$400,000) will see their PT's remain relatively neutral when compared to 2008. For example:

$$\begin{array}{r}
 +7.3\% \text{ increase} \\
 -3.7\% \text{ PT reduction} \\
 -3.7\% \text{ waste management rebate} \\
 = \quad -0.1\% \text{ reduction}
 \end{array}$$

Utilities under Council's control will increase for 2009

a) New Waste management Utility	\$182 (2008) to \$319 (2009) = \$137.00
b) Sanitary sewer utility	\$278 (2008) to \$300 (2009) = \$22.00
c) Land Drainage Utility	\$61 (2008) to \$66 (2009) = \$5.00

The total is approximately \$160.00 for PT's and Utilities.

As you can see, the 2009 impact on a household is almost exclusively due to utility increases. Non-residential property owners will not receive the \$14M PT reduction or the \$14M rebate and will pay 7.3% more in PT's but, they will not pay into the waste management utility (they have always hired private contractors to deal with their solid waste). Non-residential property owners will also pay the increased sanitary and land drainage fees.

In a 2007 (most recently available) comparison of the 24 largest Canadian cities, Edmonton ranks 3rd lowest in municipal property taxes paid. Only Calgary and Medicine Hat are lower. Calgary collects revenue from non-residential properties at a significantly higher rate, than Edmonton, which allows them to keep residential PT's lower.

When you add all utility charges (telephone, power, water, sewer, land drainage and garbage) to property tax, Edmonton is the 6th highest with London Ontario, Hamilton, Grande Prairie, Ottawa and Toronto being higher.

Lendrum Place Neighbourhood Renewal Information **January 2009 Newsletter**

The Lendrum Place neighbourhood has been identified as a candidate for renewal in 2009/2010.

Proposed construction activities in Lendrum Place include: reclamation of the roadway, an upgrade to street lighting, and reconstruction of the sidewalk, curb, and gutter. It should be noted that alley renewal is not part of this project. As part of the renewal project, the City would be including reconstruction of existing sidewalks through a 50/50 property owner/City cost share Local Improvement process.



Lendrum Place will be broken down into several Local Improvement sidewalk reconstruction projects. Project area residents will have the opportunity to support or petition against the 50/50 Local Improvement sidewalk reconstruction. Should a petition be successful in a project area, the Capital Construction Department will still reclaim the roadway, reconstruct the curb and gutter (except where it is part of the sidewalk), and upgrade street lighting. The Transportation Department will address any safety issues on sidewalks that are not reconstructed.

In order to work closely with the residents of Lendrum Place, representatives from the Capital Construction Department met with the Lendrum Place Community League Executive and provided further details on December 1, 2008. Details of the Local Improvement levy and process will be mailed out to property owners in January. An open house will be held for Lendrum Place property owners at the end of January/beginning of February.

EDMONTON 311 SERVICE

Citizens can call 311, 24-hours a day, every day of the year for access to City of Edmonton information, programs and services!



Within Edmonton city limits, dial: 3-1-1 Outside Edmonton city limits: 780-442-5311

Non-emergency calls only 311 does not replace 911. Anyone requiring fire, ambulance, police emergency assistance must call 911 for emergency assistance. All non-emergency police numbers remain unchanged.

Dialing 311 Callers will be greeted by a 311 agent. A majority of callers to 311 will find that the agent is able to assist them with their call through to completion. In other cases the details of the call will be forwarded to the appropriate department for completion of service.

Services available from 311 Citizens can access a range of information and services from the 311 agent including:

- Booking City of Edmonton inspections
- General information
- Facility scheduling information
- Program registration
- Purchasing a pet license
- Registering a bylaw complaint
- Transit information

THIN ICE SAFETY

Each winter season, ice-covered water presents a dangerous hazard to Edmontonians. For everyone's safety, please remember not to go on the ice when the **DANGER - THIN ICE** signs are posted. When the ice is at least six inches thick, the **DANGER** signs will be covered or removed by The City of Edmonton. The City does not flood, shovel, or maintain these areas. Avoid inlet/outlet areas of lakes during the winter season, as they are dangerous due to water movement. Please remember these tips: • Avoid playing on or near ice along creeks, ponds, or along the North Saskatchewan River.



WINTER DRIVING SAFETY TIPS

- **Be Prepared**-before the snow flies, and make sure that your car is winter ready. Get your car in for a maintenance check up. Some important things that should be checked are your battery, tires, and brakes.
- **Before you head out** on the road check the weather and travel conditions. The Alberta Motor Association's website [Uwww.ama.ab.ca](http://www.ama.ab.ca) Uhas up to date road reports.
- Plan your route ahead of time if you are traveling a long distance, and make sure to let someone know when you are leaving and when you expect to reach your destination.
- Make sure that your **gas tank** is sufficiently full. It is recommended that you have at least a half a tank of gas. As well, don't forget to top up your windshield washer fluid. Keep an extra jug in your trunk-just in case you run out while on the road.
- Don't forget your **cell phone** and a car charger. Use it only when necessary and only use it when you are stopped at the side of the road. If you dial 911, you will be connected to emergency services in the area.
- Allow yourself **extra travel time**, and remember to adjust your driving to the road and the driving conditions.
