

Edmonton Sweeps into First at Communities in Bloom Awards

Capital City Clean Up's innovative pilot project to reduce cigarette litter on Jasper Avenue this summer has earned it a Blue Ribbon Award from the Edmonton Tobacco Reduction Network.

"The Blue Ribbon Awards celebrate people or organizations that have done extraordinary things in tobacco reduction in Edmonton," explains Karlee Stevens, the local community services coordinator with the Canadian Cancer Society. "We just wanted to make sure Capital City Clean Up was recognized for doing an awesome thing." The project involved installing extra ashtrays along Jasper Avenue and, together with Health Canada, offering messages to help The City of Edmonton won first prize at the Communities in Bloom national awards this fall held in Vaughan, Ontario.

Competing against London, Ontario, and Halifax Regional Municipality, Edmonton won a perfect score of five out of five blooms making it Canada's most beautiful and liveable community with a population of more than 300,000. "This year we really showcased some of the excellent partnerships that exist between the City and citizen groups," says Rodney Al, the City's Communities in Bloom coordinator. "We were able to highlight the variety of activities that Edmontonians themselves are contributing to the city." people quit smoking. By the end of the project, the number of cigarette butts in the benchmark areas had been reduced by as much as 87 per cent.

"Capital City Clean Up is delighted to be nominated and honoured," says CCCU's program manager, Don Belanger, who picked up the award at the October ceremony with Judy Smith, acting branch manager for Neighbourhood and Community Development. "It's a fine way to

recognize a project that will help make Edmonton, a cleaner, healthier city."

Don Belanger and Judy Smith accepted the Edmonton Tobacco Reduction Network's Blue Ribbon Award on behalf of Capital City Clean Up.

These activities include the Partner-in-Parks

program, the Thistle Patrol (where the Edmonton Naturalization Group

pulls out invasive thistles on a weekly basis) and the Chinese Garden Society's fundraising for

a huge landscape feature in Louise McKinney Park. Capital City Clean Up (CCCU) also worked with Edmonton's Communities in Bloom on the tidiness application portion of the 2009 entry. Sharon Chapman, along with a large number of CCCU partners and dedicated volunteers, met with the judges for an afternoon in early August and wowed them with the many efforts underway to address tidiness in Edmonton. The judges were impressed to see such a broad commitment through CCCU.

Another valuable partner, the Edmonton Horticultural Society (EHS), has been involved in a number of the projects for more than a decade. These include the Partner-in-Parks program, the test gardens around the Muttart Conservatory and the EHS centennial garden in the Henrietta Muir Edwards Park. This year celebrates the 100th anniversary of the EHS.

"The judges were looking for environmental awareness, floral display and community involvement, among other things," notes Maggie Easton, EHS past president. "We feel it's an important contribution to the city and we are pleased to participate in it."

Capital Clean up a success!!!

Art Makes Vandalism Disappear Giant Street "Canvas" Attracts Young Artists

Shazad Mardhani is a happy man. In the two months since Capital City Clean Up (CCCU) unveiled a mural on his



commercial strip mall in Beverly, not one speck of graffiti has touched his wall. "A number of people have come by and been very impressed with the mural and that particular space has been graffitifree since we put it on," he says of the location at 48 Street and 118 Avenue. And given this fall's warm temperatures, he adds, that lack of spray-paint vandalism is unusual. Called *Celebrating Volunteers*, the mural is the fourth in the "Giants of Edmonton" series commissioned by

Called Celebrating Volunteers, the mural is the fourth in the "Giants of Edmonton" series commissioned by CCCU's Graffiti Management Program and 630 CHED to discourage aerosol obscenities and tagging. The mural represents volunteers in a number of different activities, It's hard for young artists to make a name for

themselves, so when Jess Hogan of VRSE Design Inc. heard about the City's Giants of Edmonton project, she applied as quickly as she could. As with all Giants murals, the subjects are chosen from nominations made by 630 CHED listeners. "When we started this program

last year we thought, for the most part, people would be nominating individuals," says Sharon Chapman, project manager of the Graffiti Management Program. "We were pleasantly surprised that people were nominating groups, such as the Canadian forces and Edmonton volunteers." Mardhani is so pleased with the Giants of Edmonton program that he is even considering murals for some of his other buildings. "What I like about this particular initiative by the City is that it creates a positive synergy between the community groups, the City and the artists who are looking for ways to express themselves."
