Lendrum Place Neighbourhood Renewal ...

One streets sidewalks, (Project #23) the area on 111A st. between 54 Ave & 55 Ave is slated for repair (grinding, mudjacking, &/or asphalt patching) not replacement as the rest of the community. During the process it became apparent that 6 of the corner lots in this area share borders with other projects that are getting new walks, these properties will not receive new sidewalks on the side facing project 23. However the side of these corner lots that face a project that was not defeated will be replaced, and accordingly have to pay for that portion of the improvement based on the size of that part of the property. Under the agreements the city will start repairing the walks in question with some or all of the processes shown below. However there is a window of opportunity for residents in the effected area, signing a new letter of intent would allow the area to be reconsidered for full replacement. If successful the process would then be back in the city's hands for formal notification to residents effected, costs under current trends for this type of work could potentially come in lower than the original estimates that were completed last year.

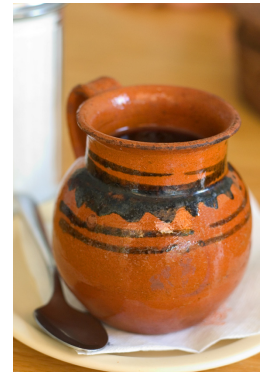

South-West Resident Thrilled with Malmo & Lendrum LRT Parking

University Student, Felix Parksalota, couldn't be happier with the convenient, free on-street parking in Malmo & Lendrum to get him to U of A. "With my car and no-additional-cost U of A transit pass, I will finally be able to get to school without the cost, time and hassle I currently have. All my Facebook friends are absolutely giddy about it."

His mom, clearing away dishes, was equally excited, "I won't have the hassle of taking a connector bus any more to get to my job downtown. I can park-n-ride in Lendrum now!"

With this level of excitement of a more convenient transportation option for split driver-LRT riders, there is sure to be plenty of competition for the limited on-street parking in the east end of Lendrum after the LRT station opens on April 25, 2010.

(Important Note: This article is a work of fiction to draw attention to an impending problem for our community)

What's A Residential Parking Program?



A Residential Parking Program can be established to ensure parking will be available for residents in areas with a high on-street parking demand, such as an area nearby an LRT station.

Permits

Permits are available to residents of single family homes and multi-family buildings under four (4) stories in height within the program area. For new zones there are two types of Residential Parking Permits: Annual and Temporary.

Fees

There is no charge for residential parking permits.

Annual Permits

This permit allows residents within a Residential Parking Program area (i.e. a neighbourhood with signs along the streets stating “Except Residents With Valid Permit”) to park their vehicles on the street. Valid vehicle registration is required along with proof of residency. Items used as proof of residency can be a driver’s licence, utility bill, lease agreement or purchase agreement, or a letter from the landlord. If the vehicle is registered in someone else’s name, then a letter authorizing vehicle usage is required from the registered owner (e.g. if an offspring is using the parent’s car, a letter from the parent authorizing such use is required.) The permit must be displayed on the drivers side front windshield and must be completely visible from the outside of the vehicle. Once a resident has applied for and obtained a permit the first time, a renewal letter is sent out each year and the annual permit is sent in the mail.



Temporary Permits

All Residential Parking Program area residents are eligible, under certain guidelines, for temporary permits. Allowances are made for renovations, out of town guests, seniors, disabled persons and one-time social events like weddings or barbecues.

If you have a vehicle that is over 4500kg it cannot be legally parked in any residential area, with or without a permit. Overweight vehicles may be tagged and towed.

How Could Malmo & Lendrum Obtain a Residential Parking Program?

We have been informed by the Director Traffic Control (Traffic Operations Branch, Transportation Department, City of Edmonton) that Malmo will definitely have a parking problem after the LRT station opens. The problem is expected to extend deep into Malmo & Lendrum based on the experience of other LRT Stations. The sooner we commence the official City procedure below, the better. If you care about your rights and community, consider volunteering to canvas residents and gather petition signatures: the volunteer form is at the end of this article.

Minimum Area Requirement

Placement of parking restrictions in a residential area must be implemented over a sufficient area so that the influx of non-resident parking does not shift to the adjacent roadways.

The necessity in maintaining the minimum ten square block area is required to justify the costs of administration and implementation of the parking program. Relaxation of the area requirement would result in numerous requests for residential parking programs, which if implemented, would be both difficult to administer and enforce.

All new program areas will include time-restricted parking. Notification is subject to petition by the Community League.

Implementation Procedure

1. Community League contacts the Transportation Department for approval in principle of the proposed program. The approval will consider: Area Boundaries (under contention), Type of Non-Resident Parking Restriction, Petition Format, Land Uses.
2. Neighbourhood Representatives circulate approved petition to area residents.
3. Completed petition is submitted to Transportation Department for consideration/summation. No incomplete or insufficient petitions will be accepted.
4. A resident support of 2/3 (two-thirds) majority is required. If majority is reached, notice will be sent to affected residents outlining details of the proposed parking program. This method will enable all opposing residents the opportunity to raise their concerns.
5. If sufficient support to the program is received, steps toward approval from City Council are initiated.

Approval Process

1. Resident support for the parking program is received via petition to the Transportation Department.
2. The Transportation Department reviews petition and prepares Traffic Bulletin for distribution to area residents explaining parking program and the impact on the area of implementation.
3. Transportation Department records all responses to petition and if majority of residents continue to support the parking program, a report is submitted to City Council for approval of the program.
4. If City Council approval is granted, the Transportation Department distributes a final traffic bulletin to the affected residents. Residents are informed as to the procedure for obtaining permits and when the program will be implemented.

Residential Parking Programs Removal

Residential Parking Programs may be removed entirely or on a block by block basis. The need for a 2/3 (two-third) majority support is still required. If on a block by block basis, the Transportation Department will remove the parking program, subject to confirmation of majority support from the block. Should the entire parking program be requested for removal, upon confirmation of majority support, the Transportation Department will initiate steps toward approval from City Council.

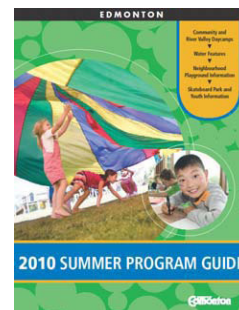

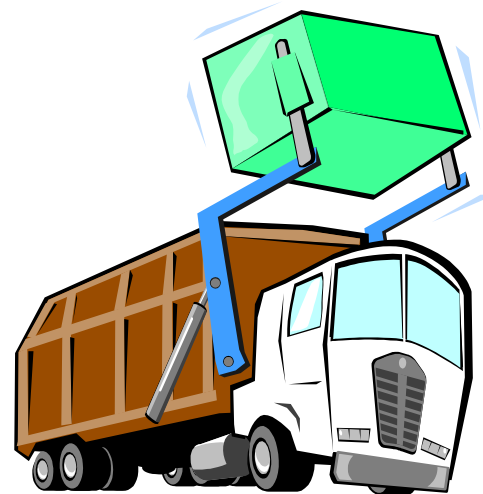

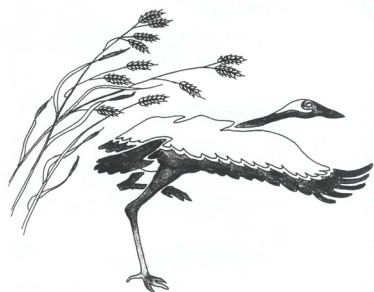
