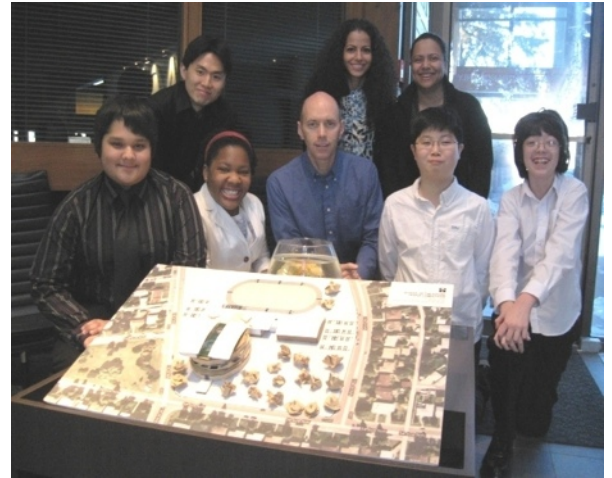


Lendrum Area Schools

Avalon Architecture Club

Over this past school year, a group of students and adults have been meeting to participate in a competition called "Schools of the Future". The students were paired with two intern architects from ACI Architecture in Edmonton, and they assisted in guiding the students through the building design process. The students' brain-stormed ideas, made multiple sketches, and then transferred their ideas onto a computer program that generates 3 dimensional drawings. The club also built a scale model of their school using recycled materials - it looks pretty good! This activity is sponsored by an organization entitled Council of Educational Facility Planners International, and in early January our group from Avalon competed with five other groups from around the province of Alberta.

Teacher Mr. Dan Tarney and the club were very excited when they discovered that they were the provincial champs for the first round of the competition, and they fine tuned their presentation skills for the regional play-down. Here, they had their design ideas compared against groups from Alaska, British Columbia, and Washington State. A group of jurors visited Edmonton on February 1st, and the Avalon Architecture Club displayed their sketches, drawings, scale model, pointwer point presentation and public speaking skills during this second presentation.

SECOND PLACE WINNER: Avalon Junior High School, Edmonton, Alberta. This exciting concept created a dynamic focus for the school through a roof top garden and internal light tube. Robust alternative energy strategies make this school truly self sustaining. They are the first Canadian entry in the School of the Future Competition. Presented with enthusiasm the team clearly explained their ideas for the future of learning. Congratulations to Avalon on a job well done. 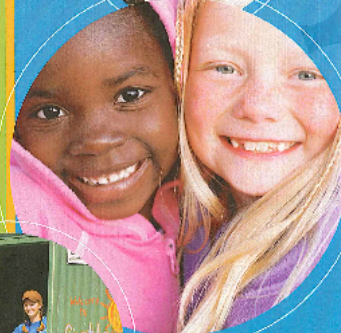
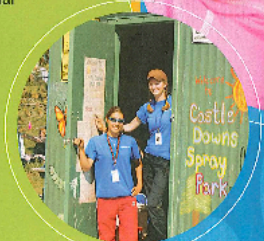

February Is Heart Month

Do you know the signs and symptoms of a heart attack and what to do if someone experiences these? Knowing can make the difference between life and death.

Recognizing and responding immediately to the warning signs of a potential heart attack can significantly improve survival and recovery. **February is Heart Month** - take the time to be heart safe and learn how you can reduce your risk.

Know the signs of a heart attack

(Any or all of these signs & symptoms may occur)

- Chest pain described as crushing, squeezing, pressure or chest heaviness;
- Pain that moves beyond the chest such as shoulder, arm, neck or jaw pain;
- Shortness of breath, sweating or nausea and vomiting.

Reduce your risk

Heart attack risk factors include:

- Obesity
- Sedentary lifestyle
- Smoking
- High cholesterol
- Age / Gender
- Family history

Speak with your doctor about how to treat your modifiable risk factors and learn to be heart safe.

What to do when seconds count

- Call 9-1-1 immediately. Early treatment can greatly reduce heart damage and make the difference of life and death.
- Treatment starts the moment EMS arrives. Paramedics can provide oxygen, start an intravenous and perform an electrocardiogram (ECG).
- Paramedics can also administer important medications in the early minutes of a heart attack to lessen heart damage.
- During transport, EMS will also share information with the hospital so definitive treatment can begin immediately on arrival.
- Take a CPR/AED (automated external defibrillator) course. Training is widely available from many reputable organizations. It's easy, inexpensive, and only takes a few hours.



Please call a Neighbourhood Watch number if you have any information that needs to be reported to our network. We then can alert people to be more watchful & to increase security measures (The police do not call us).

Burns and Scalds

Every month Alberta Health Services EMS responds to emergencies where a young child has sustained severe burns or scalds. These incidents often occur inside the child's own home. Common causes include a child accidentally tipping hot liquids onto themselves, touching a hot surface, or making contact with an electrical outlet. Fortunately, incidents such as these can be avoided by taking simple preventative measures.

Degrees of burn

- **1°:** Affects only the top layers of the skin; appears red like a sun burn; discomfort is generally tolerable.
- **2°:** Deeper and much more painful than 1° burns; broken skin or blisters commonly develop.
- **3°:** Severe: the deepest layers of skin and tissue are injured; may appear charred or leathery.

First Aid for burns

- Skin may continue to burn if not aggressively cooled. Immediately douse burns with large amounts of cold water.
- Cover the burn with a sterile dressing, or any clean, non-fluffy material to protect from infection.
- Over the counter medications may be used for pain. Adhere to directions given on the label.
- Seek further medical attention from your doctor as required.

Prevention of burns

- Check the temperature of your hot water tank. Many homes keep hot water temperatures as high as 60°C / 140°F. This temperature will scald a child in just seconds.
- Use placemats instead of tablecloths. Tablecloths can be yanked downward causing hot drinks or food to spill on a child.
- Turn pot handles to the back of the stove and ensure cords from kettles, slow cookers, and other electrical appliances cannot be reached.
- Avoid picking up a child while holding any hot liquids.
- Ensure electrical outlets are made secure by installing commercially available safety devices that prohibit access.

If you require immediate medical attention for a burn, **call 9-1-1.**

Lendrum Privacy Fence

This fence was the result of negotiations between Lendrum and Malmo community leagues and the city of Edmonton when the South LRT concept plans were brought to our communities.

There were many meetings held with the city, trying to get a noise fence (fence along Groat Rd.) originally, but we were told that we did not have the db level needed for such a fence. We still wanted some type of fence to block the view of the resident's yards that back onto 111 Street from the LRT trains. This was the first time that the LRT was going to be going through a residential neighborhood.

We as a group of residents who back onto 111 Street agreed to accept the fence that we now have, although there are some deficiencies in the design. As part of the agreement, our community league accepted responsibility for maintenance of the fence. Some of these items include the removal of graffiti and minor repairs.

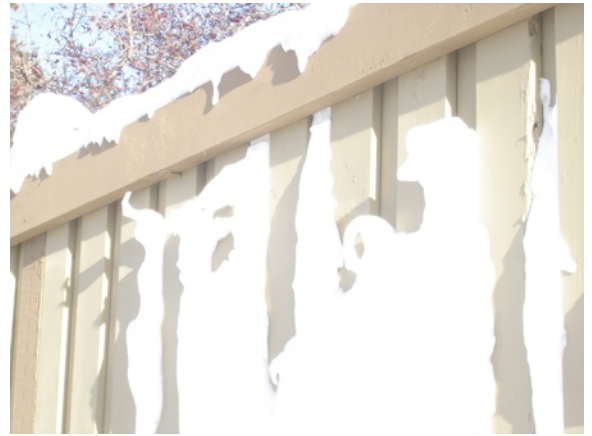

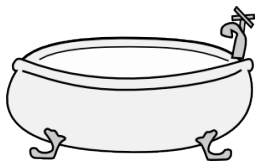

At this time of year many of us can't wait for spring and the chance to get out in the garden again. The volunteer gardeners at the Green & Gold Community garden are already making plans for our third gardening season. The garden is located on the University of Alberta South Campus, bordered by the communities of Lendrum, Malmo, Grandview, Lansdowne, Belgravia, McKernan, Park Allen and Windsor Park. The garden is an initiative of the University's School of Public Health and Faculty of Agricultural, Life and Environmental Sciences. Volunteers operate the garden and all of their time, the seeds, plants and equipment used are donated.

The vegetables, herbs and flowers are "spray-free" (no pesticides or artificial fertilizers are used). Anyone is welcome to 'purchase' their vegetables at the garden and every penny of the money raised— that's 100% — goes to the **Tubahumurize Association**, a non-profit organization in Rwanda that provides socially and economically marginalized women with vocational training, counselling, life-skills coaching, health care education, and opportunities for sustainable income generating activities. Most individuals who benefit from Tubahumurize are genocide survivors and many are widows or orphans, HIV infected, and survivors of physical and sexual violence. Last year the garden raised over \$22,000 for the Tubahumurize project.

We are now gearing up for the 2011 gardening season, and are looking for volunteers. Volunteers are always needed to help with the garden – both novice & experienced gardeners are always welcome. The Lendrum Memories and Archives Project

This past summer I attended Catherine Stout's block party. I found myself talking with the parents of friends I had gone to school with at Avalon [1970/1973] and learned what was going on in the lives of my long-ago pals Scott, Dave, and Murray. Many other stories came up and it made me realize that we in Lendrum have no recorded history from our community's beginnings to the present day.

Residents of Lendrum, I think it's very important that we pool our memories, photos, and collected writings to produce a published compendium before they all become lost to us forever.

Recently I met Mrs. McLaughlin, who claims her house was the first one built in Lendrum. Do you know which lot was the last to be developed? Do you know that Lendrum was Premier Harry Strom's residence away from his home in Bow Island? Do you know which house his family lived in?

A Lendrum music teacher, Mrs. Brooks, once taught a boy who went on to become a world-class pianist: Marek Jablonski. J.P. Wagner opened Lendrum Elementary School. Before we even had a hall, Lendrum Community League met at Cross of Christ Lutheran Church for the Deaf [thank you!]

These are only some of the little snippets of information I either knew or learned in a very short time—just imagine all the information stored in the minds and photo albums of all the residents here, especially the seniors, of which some have lived in Lendrum since it was developed. But you don't have to be a senior to contribute your stories to this project. This is open to everybody of all ages and will encompass every year so that no one is excluded from participating.

There should be no shortage of things to write about: from early Lendrum dirt roads and alleys, the shopping mall and schools being built, anecdotes about neighbourhood characters, sports teams, community events, to stories about what you like about living in Lendrum, who your favorite school teacher is [was], perhaps what your experience here is now and what you hope for the future of the neighbourhood. Anything goes!

Your participation with this project is needed. It can't happen without your contributions. The community league is in the process of arranging meeting places at different times for residents to have fun exchanging stories and hopefully make new friends.

A project this size needs to be shaped by those interested in seeing it through to completion. Organizing it requires delegation, too. I can't carry this by myself, so I'm looking for help here. Please phone me at (780) 439-4792 to talk more about this. Thank you.

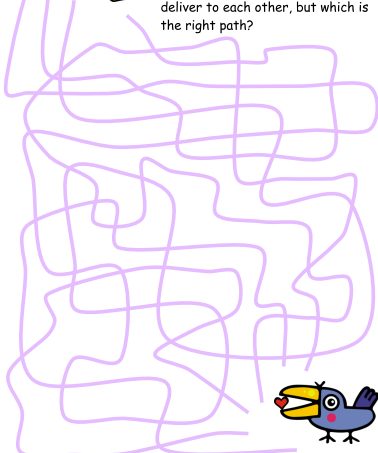
