In 1883 the Russian Czar, Alexander, commissioned Faberge to make a special Easter gift for his wife, the Empress Marie. The first Faberge egg was an egg within an egg. It had an outside shell of platinum and enameled white which opened to reveal a smaller gold egg. The smaller egg, in turn, opened to display a golden chicken and a jeweled replica of the Imperial crown. This special Faberge egg so delighted the Czarina that the Czar promptly ordered the Faberge firm to design further eggs to be delivered every Easter. In later years Nicholas II, Alexander's so continued the custom. Fifty-seven eggs were made in all.





Operation Mobile Speed Bump...Update

Well summer is around the corner, and with that comes the speeders and people that just are not paying attention to pedestrians. Lets all continue the habit of driving through and around our school and park area at 30 km or slightly less. It is a little thing that helps to reduce the short cutters that are using our streets as a race track

Excessive Noise from Vehicles

We've all experienced it, vehicles with loud stereos that seem to vibrate the walls of your home as they pass by and vehicles with modified exhaust systems that can be heard for several city blocks.

Edmonton, like other urban centres throughout the country, is receiving repeated complaints about excessive vehicle noise. Numerous noise complaints have come in through city councillors, the Chief's town hall meetings, in the media and the public calling in on the police complaint line.

- Loud and excessive noise can be characterized as noise that becomes a nuisance to the general public, taking into consideration the nature, location, time and proximity of the source to residents and members of the public. An example of this would include a loud auto stereo or car, truck or motorcycle exhaust emitting sound to the extent it disturbs patrons at a café, nearby residents or other motorists on the roadway.
- Loud and excessive noise is now being addressed as a community disorder issue in Edmonton. Traffic and Patrol members are conducting an enforcement campaign in an effort to crack down on offenders.

If operated normally, most original or equipment in any vehicle should not emit excessive noise. Check the equipment that you do have to ensure your exhaust system does not emit excessive noise through a widened outlet that amplifies the noise. Also ensure that your system is equipped with baffles. Have consideration for those around you and avoid aggressive use of your equipment.

Fines for Violation

The EPS will charge violators at three benchmark noise levels tested with the motorcycle stationary.:

- Violators in excess of 92 dbA at idle for all motorcycles
- Violators in excess of 96 dbA at 2000 rpm for motorcycles having less than 3 cylinders or more than 4 cylinders
- Violators in excess of 100 dbA at 5000 rpm for motorcycles with 3 or 4 cylinders.

The fine for violation of this **bylaw** is \$250.00.

Sections of the **Traffic Safety Act** can also be used when dealing with excessive noise.



Have you heard about the "Give the Gift of Life" Fun Run and Walk on May 1?

The snow is starting to melt and we bet you can't wait to get outside to take a walk or run, shedding your heavy boots for your favourite sneakers.

We have an opportunity if you'll take the challenge!

Over 4,000 Canadians are waiting for an organ transplant right now so the donation message has never been more important. Kidney transplants are the treatment of choice for people with end stage kidney disease, and it is the only present means to recover some quality of life and its expectancy. The "Give the Gift of Life" Fun Run and Walk is one way that we work toward increasing awareness of the need for organ and tissue donation, and to raise funds to deliver public education about it.

Would you join us May 1st to walk or run for the cause?

This year will be our 7^{th} annual walk, and our goal is to raise \$70,000.00. We know there are a good number of charity walks from which you can choose to walk and fund raise. Over 200 people have died waiting for a transplant since our last walk. We want to reduce that number by this same time next year.

That's Not Garbage!

If you've ever puzzled over where to pitch your pizza box, the City of Edmonton's newly expanded times for their free seminar on recycling will help you find the answers. "We've been offering our "That's Not Garbage!" sessions to Edmonton businesses for some time now," explains Garry Spotowski, education programs coordinator for the city's Waste Management Branch.

"But now we want to reach out to all community groups, seniors' societies, church organizations...essentially any small or large group of fifteen or more adults interested in learning about recycling and our world-class waste management system. We'll come to their assembly anytime - days, evenings, even weekends. Edmonton's system is one of the best anywhere. We'd like to make sure people know all about it."Carole Soanes thinks everyone should register for "That's Not Garbage!" The federal employee organized the one-hour session for co-workers last summer.

"I don't think most of us had a clue what the City of Edmonton was really doing beyond the blue bag. We were all taken back by the information provided and certainly didn't know that Edmonton was such a leader in the world of waste management."

The presenter was full of information about how to properly dispose of items you no longer needed, and where to find recyclable materials that you do need, often for free. "It was such a detailed presentation, talking about all the facilities and aspects of waste management and the tours that are available, the Eco Stations where you can pick up recycled paint for free, and the Reuse Centre, where you can go buy recycled stationary (\$5 for all you can carry out)," said Soanes. "I didn't have a clue about most of this information and I think many people in the class felt the same way."

Join Edmonton's emergency response community as it helps kids and adults learn how to prepare for an emergency as part of Emergency Preparedness Week 2010.

ATCO Gas has partnered with the City of Edmonton to put on this year's "Get Ready in the Park" event. **Come visit** the ATCO Gas tent while you're down at Hawrelak Park between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Saturday, May 7. We have a "Locate Challenge", furnace inspection advice for homeowners, door prize draws, food safety information if your power goes out, and much more.

Children at the event will be given a "Passport to Preparedness." After collecting 10 stamps (initials) by visiting participating organizations kids will be eligible to enter to win prizes. There's plenty to see, do, learn and takeaway from at this free family-focused event.

More than 25 exhibitors from municipal, provincial, federal, corporate and non-profit organizations will be on site with demonstrations, interactive games and free giveaways for the whole family.

Emergency Preparedness Week is an annual, national event held this year from May 2 – 8. Here in Edmonton, the main objectives are showcasing Edmonton's emergency community capabilities in responding to major emergencies, increasing awareness about individual emergency preparedness and encourage residents to be prepared in the event of major emergency so that we can all reduce the risks and lessen the consequences of disasters. Primary goals of emergency preparedness are taking care of yourself and your family for a minimum of three days (72 hours.) If a disaster happens in your community, it may take emergency workers some time to get to you as they help those in desperate need.

General Interest

First Ward Gathering a Success:

How do we increase the number of families living in our mature neighbourhoods? This very important question was the trailhead into a wideranging discussion hosted April 7th by Edmonton Public School Trustee Michael Janz and City Councillor Don Iveson. Approximately 40 local community leaders gathered to discuss community revitalization, keeping schools open, family and seniors friendly housing and much more. A summary of the meeting and the discussion has been posted on Trustee Janz's

website: www.michaeljanz.ca. Discussion was wide ranging and leaders present were given a homework assignment to continue the conversation at their school councils and community leagues.



As our city continues to sprawl, the pressure for providing new services, libraries, parks, roads, and schools for new developments continues to reduce the funding available for maintaining infrastructure in the core. The city has started to signal an intention to move towards a more compact, walkable, urban city, but last year only 7% of new developments were in the core. Low enrollment continues to put schools in mature neighbourhoods at risk of closure or consolidation. Leaders present stressed the need for complete communities with vibrancy, ammenities, and the need for us as residents of mature neighbourhoods to tell the story about how our communities are safe, desirable, and worth investing in.

This was the first Ward Gathering hosted by Trustee Janz. The next will be focused on student health and wellness and will be taking place in Riverbend area in June.

Capital City Clean Up -ADOPT-A-BLOCK

Capital City Clean Up (CCCU) is the City of Edmonton's litter abatement program to reduce litter on streets, parks and public places. Using the Adopt-a-Block approach, residents and businesses volunteer to keep their "block" litter-free. 
