This year promises to be full of many interesting, artistic & educational workshops, field trips and events. The first school wide event was the annual Terry Fox Run which was held on Sept. 28. The official total amount of money raised was \$3386.00.WOW! That is an incredible amount of money for 128 students! We were honored to be able to present Michelle Fuller, of the Terry Fox Donation a mock cheque for this amount at our October assembly.

A movie premiere was held on Oct 31 as part of our Halloween activities. This is the first of many workshops visiting Lendrum School in the coming year.





Dear Neighbours-

There is a lot at stake here for us.

The U of A has massive plans for its South Campus lands, the former university farm (including the West 240).

These will affect everyone who lives in this part of Edmonton, none more than those of us in the neighborhoods close to the site.

The development of South Campus is filled with great opportunity, and also with great risk. The benefits will only outweigh the costs if the development is done well, according to a credible plan prepared in accordance with the best practices in urban planning.

Here are just a few of the university's latest developments and plans:


- the GO Centre (with a reported 1.5 million users/year, or 4000 visitors a day)
- a radioisotope production plant at the Balmoral curling site.
- residences for 7000 students (equivalent to the population of three full neighborhoods)
- twin arenas
- a new fieldhouse
- an aquatics centre
- three new parkades
- a number of new roads and intersections to provide access

There may well be other plans on the drawing board that university administrators have not made public. For example, the Faculty of Agriculture is engaged in a closed planning process for the south quarter.

Over the past year, community leagues from neighborhoods most affected by the redevelopment of South Campus have formed the South Campus Neighbourhood Coaltion (SCNC) so we have a stronger community voice as these plans are formed and implemented.

Please have a look at what the coalition is doing, and let us know your thoughts.

Current Process

The Go Centre Timeline

The GO Centre provides an example of how university administrators have managed South Campus development.

In February, 2008, a Memorandum of Understanding was signed between the U of A and the Go Community Group. That MOU states that the GO Centre's business case, final design and site layout "shall have the broad support of the neighbouring community (with whom close collaboration must be established throughout the design and development phase)."

Judge for yourself if this requirement was fulfilled.

In October, 2008, the university informs its community committee that as the GO Centre moves forward, communities will be consulted.

The following month, the university's Community South Campus Open House does NOT identify the GO Centre as a possible development.

In March, 2009, the university informs its community committee that the GO Centre partnership is just getting started, and says that when the schematic design process is complete it will be brought to the communities.

Thirteen months later, on April 20, 2010, the university and the GO Community Group hold a public open house with the schematic design displays.

The catch? Construction had already begun on the GO Centre the month before.

The Radioisotope Production Facility at the Balmoral Site

It looks like this process is repeating itself with the development of a radioisotope production facility at the site of the Balmoral Curling Club.

The SCNC has learned that by November, 2010, university administrators had committed the Balmoral site for a radioisotope production facility, detailed drawings had been prepared, and millions of dollars in equipment ordered.

Yet two months later, in January, 2011, neighborhood representatives on the university's community committee (UA/CC) were told that the future of the site was undecided, and no mention was made of radioisotope production.

On May 9, 2011, the Belgravia Community League was contacted by the university and told that the university was considering two options for the Balmoral site. One was as a facility to support a vehicle pool. The other was as a facility to produce radioisotopes.

The Belgravia Community League executive was asked in writing by university administrators *not to share this information with the public.*

On May 26th, with almost no publicity, the university held an information meeting attended by a small handful of community members (about six), to brief them on the choice between a vehicle pool and a radioisotope facility. Those present agreed that the radioisotope facility was acceptable.

In September, 2011, the university awarded a contract for construction of the facility, and in October, notified residents in surrounding communities of a public information meeting.



We Just Want What's Reasonable...



Based on what we've heard from our neighbours, here are key things SCNC is seeking with regards to South Campus:

- 1. a meaningful consultation process for development, similar to those required of everyone else; no more tokenism.
- 2. a long-range development plan, with a formal commitment to adhere to the plan and the oversight that will ensure it is followed over time.
- 3. sustainable development, environmentally, financially and socially. A "Top 20 Campus for a Top 20 University."
- 4. transportation planning that works for all of us, based on the 2002 commitment to public transportation, cycling, and walking. No more traffic and parking nightmares.
- 5. quality architecture that reflects the nature of the surrounding neighbourhoods, and enhances the University and city.
- 6. innovative development that enhances our neighborhoods, includes green space and buffers, and maintains the "family friendly feel" of our communities.

What to expect on Edmonton streets this winter

The City of Edmonton is committed to keeping streets in good winter driving condition throughout the snow season, and crews work around the clock to achieve that goal.



There are a number of changes that have been implemented this winter:

- A seasonal parking ban has been created that will impact residential bus routes. The City of Edmonton
 will call a ban with a minimum of eight hours notice. At that time, vehicles must be moved from those
 routes with the 'Seasonal Parking Ban' signs; those not moved after the eight hours will be tagged and
 towed.
- Once priority routes are plowed, crews will move into residential areas to blade to a 5 cm snow pack. Even if there is another snow event that requires additional work on priority routes, crews will NOT be removed from residential areas until the blading cycle has been finished.
- If the snow pack on residential streets cannot be maintained at 5 cm, crews will plow down to bare pavement where required.
- Windrows will be kept to a minimum on residential streets and will not be removed; every effort will be made to keep them at a maximum height of 30 cm in front of driveways. If crews have to plow down to bare pavement, windrows will be higher and there may be some delay before skid steers are able to clear driveways.
- Windrows will be removed on a regular basis from school drop off zones, seniors centres and Edmonton Transit bus stops.

Stay in the Know About Snow!

You can find out when the City calls a bus route parking ban in several ways. Media announcements will be made, information will be on the City of Edmonton website, and postings will be made via the City of Edmonton's Facebook page and Twitter account. You can also sign up for free, confidential email notification by visiting www.edmonton.ca/winterroads and clicking on 'Subscribe to Roadway Alerts.'

Information on **residential street clearing** will be available through the City of Edmonton's website via our new **interactive map**. By visiting www.edmonton.ca/winterroads and clicking on 'Residential Snow Plowing Schedule,' you can select the Snow Clearing Map tool and enter your address. The system will then give you an exact date that work will start on in your area.

For those without computer access, the same information about parking bans and residential street maintenance can be accessed by calling 3-1-1. You can also advise 3-1-1 about specific issues of concern related to winter road maintenance and that information will be forwarded to the appropriate department.



Emergency Medical Services

Cold weather safety



Alberta Health Services EMS responds to many cold weather related emergencies every winter. Simple actions such as dressing appropriately and anticipating sudden weather changes can help keep you both warm and safe this season.

Frostnip

- Frostnip occurs when skin is extremely cold, but not frozen. It commonly affects the ears, nose, cheeks, fingers and toes.
- The skin appears red but also turns to white when pressed. It may feel numb to the touch.
- When treated promptly, frostnipped skin will heal without complication.
- Gently re-warming the affected area in a warm environment is advised.

Frostbite

- Frostbite is when skin becomes so cold, the skin and underlying tissue freeze completely.
- It may look white and waxy and will feel hard to the touch.
- Treatment begins with removal from the cold environment and placing the affected area in warm, not hot, water (about 41°C) until re-warmed.
- Seek further medical attention as required.

Hypothermia

- Hypothermia is abnormally low body temperature (less than 34°C as compared to normal body temperature of about 37°C).
- People suffering hypothermia may act inappropriately with uncharacteristic stumbling, mumbling, and fumbling, as their body temperature continues to lower.
- Early recognition and prompt medical attention is crucial. Left untreated, hypothermia may progress to coma and death.
- Call 9-1-1. Don't forget to protect yourself from the factors that originally lead to the patient's situation.
- Gentle re-warming should start as quickly as possible including: removal of wet or
 constrictive clothing, covering with blankets or sleeping bags, and protecting the
 patient from further heat loss (wind, moisture and contact with cold surfaces).




