Pets In the City

First of all make sure your dog has a licence. It's his ticket home if he gets lost! Licence fees pay for the City's lost and found services, education and enforcement programs and the upkeep of dog parks. Licenses are inexpensive, running you \$35 a year for a fixed dog. The alternative is a \$250 fine!

If you start your walk from home, resist the temptation to take Fido to the nearest school ground, sports field, picnic area or playground. He is safest at the end of your leash and must stay 10 metres (32 feet) away from these sites. Stick to the permanent trails. It's a matter of cleanliness and respect for others.

Remember if they poop, you scoop. Cleaning up ensures Edmonton remains a healthy and attractive place to live and play. It's also the law, and the fine for not picking up is \$100. Leave green spaces clean for the next person enjoying a walk in the park.

Did you know that Edmonton has more than 40 off leash sites? When you take your buddy to stretch his legs, please follow the code of conduct at these dog parks. Keep your pet in sight; control any bad behaviour; pick up poop; and use a leash until you are inside the site boundaries.

If you own a dog in Edmonton you've got tons of great options to get outdoors. Just remember, your pet is your responsibility. For more information about off leash parks or pet bylaws, please visit www.edmonton.ca/pets

Song Birds...

We see our neighbour's cats out hunting birds, they frequently patrol around our houses and through the park areas where they can easily ambush feeding, nesting or sleeping birds.

According to Bridgett Stutchbury, a noted biologist who has studied migratory birds for over 20 years, and wrote "[Silence of the Songbirds](#)", HaperCollins 2007. She says that domestic cats in North America kill hundreds of millions of birds a year... they have increased in number and on average kill at least one bird a week. (From an analysis of cat poop).

Migratory birds face many challenges, including habitat loss in the tropics and here on the nesting grounds, bright lights of cities during migration, storms over the Gulf of Mexico, pesticide use in South and Central America, towers, and as mentioned, predation by domestic and feral cats.

Things we can do: KEEP CATS INDOORS, buy shade grown coffee, buy paper products made from recycled materials, buy/eat local, avoid use of and purchasing food grown with pesticides.

Another school year has come and gone. What a busy year it has been! The students of Ecole Avalon/Lendrum are extremely fortunate to have such wonderful parental support and community involvement. The old adage "it takes an entire village to raise a child" certainly rings true in this community.

As always there has been plenty of activity at the Lendrum Campus. This year's Spring Tea and Gallery Walk was once again quite successful. The student art work displayed in the hallways was FANTASTIC! There were also many out of school field trips and in school presentations and workshops. Students went to the Winspear to listen to the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra as well, the kindergarten classes visited Rutherford House. The grade 6 students are off to Birch Bay Camp for the day to try their hand at climbing, horseback riding and zip lining. I am sure they will have a great time. Hip Hop Artist Dani Altieri taught the entire school hip hop dance through a week long workshop. The grand finale, "Hip Hop Around The World" was extremely well done and great fun to watch.

Not to be out done, Avalon has also been a bee hive of activity. This spring has seen two overseas trips; France and Costa Rica. Everyone had a fabulous time, learning about the history, experiencing the culture and making new friends. The outdoor education classes for grades 7, 8 & 9 also had overnight camping trips. The grade 9 class did survival training, 3 days and 2 nights in the rain with minimal gear. Our band students attended a 3 day/2 night band camp, where they learned, performed, and had a great time.

Our athletic Knights "*shone*" this year. Our cross country running team finished 2nd overall in the city, with junior boys finishing 3rd, senior girls finishing 2nd and junior girls finishing 1st. The senior boys soccer team made it to quarter-finals before losing out, and the senior girls soccer team made it all the way to the bronze medal final, but ended up losing a hard fought game. Our senior girls volleyball team lost in the quarter-finals this year, but our senior boys volleyball team won the gold medal in the City division. Avalon's wrestling team had a great year with many solid individual performances including two gold medals at City Championships, four silver medals and five bronze medals. The senior boys and girls basketball teams both made it to quarter-finals before being knocked out of the play-offs. Our indoor journal games teams all had success with three out of four teams qualifying for the semi-final races. Avalon's indoor soccer team made it all the way to the bronze medal final before losing in a shootout. Both of Avalon's curling team's captured bronze medals this season. Our senior badminton team finished tied for 3rd in the City. Avalon's track & field team saw 65 athletes participate in the zone trials and almost half of those athletes are heading to City Championships. Finally, our slo-pitch team is off to a great start and is hoping to medal for the 4th straight year.

GOOD LUCK to all the grade 6 and grade 9 students in their upcoming Provincial Achievement Tests. You will do wonderful!

Welcome to all the new students that will be attending Ecole Avalon/Lendrum in the fall, and farewell to those students and families that are moving on. Your time with us will be treasured. Good luck in your new endeavors.

Panhandling



Edmontonians are urged to give money to social services agencies rather than give dollars directly to panhandlers. These agencies need your support. If you want to make real life changes for someone in need, donate your money or time to agencies. That's the message of a panhandling awareness campaign called Have a Heart-Give Smart.

Giving money to panhandlers may:

- support drug and alcohol addictions
- discourage panhandlers from accessing community resources that can help
- encourage them to work specific areas which can eventually lead to police intervention

Not all panhandlers are homeless. Many, however, share the same issues as people who are homeless -- addictions, mental health issues, living in poverty. There are many places in Edmonton that provide free food, shelter and support. They help thousands of Edmontonians. Regular free meals are available throughout the city. The "Have a Heart – Give Smart" car will appear around town from June 25 until the end of August this year. Staff members at the car give information about panhandling and about the social agencies that provide free food, shelter and support.

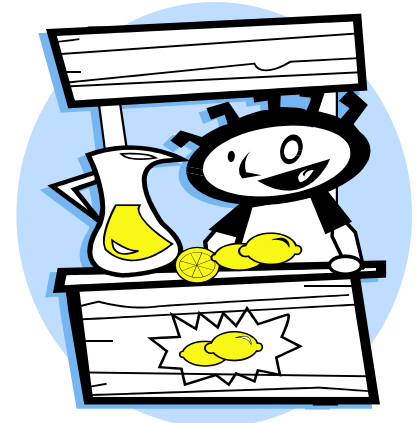
Lendrum Hall Concession

1) Fraser Institute Student Scholarship - \$1,000 – 3 Awards (Deadline: June 30, 2012)

Showcase your ideas on public policy and the role of markets by writing an essay. Each year the Institute holds a competition for students, designed to encourage and develop student writers.

To be eligible for this scholarship you must write an essay on the 2012 topic chosen by the Fraser Institute.
