



Lendrum Nature News

What a wonderful summer it has been. Our naturalized area produced lots of beautiful native flowers and an abundance of big juicy saskatoons! I hope you were able to enjoy some of them.

Some of the highlights of the season include:

Large numbers of dragonflies, all sizes, all colours - maybe that's why the mosquitoes were not much of a problem. We also saw lots of different butterflies around the area.



We installed some of the new nest boxes received from Avalon Junior High School, and the house sparrows moved in immediately. We have since modified the openings to keep sparrows out. We hope to attract house wrens and tree swallows.

You have probably noticed the lovely new bench, placed in memory of Theresa Hiebert. It's a great place to sit and eat saskatoons.



The wild roses and potentilla provided beautiful splashes of pink and yellow flowers that the bees just loved. We hope to see some of the solitary bees occupying the bee hotels that the grade 8 students built for us.

Watch for a growing brush pile under a dead poplar that will provide shelter and nesting habitat for birds and insects in all four seasons.

Once again we consulted with Cherry Dodd and Diana Baragar from the Edmonton Naturalization Group. They were pleased to see so many of our native flowers and grasses doing so well. We are still dealing with non-native

invasives and hope that over time the native plants will dominate – we'll see. Meanwhile we are controlling them as much as possible.

You will have noticed the Canada geese on the move between the

river and the University farm. Some of the smaller birds have already flown south. They start leaving in mid-August once the young ones are fledged and independent.

Please contact me with your list of summer bird sightings as I am compiling a four-season list of birds in Lendrum. Any nesting information would be most welcome. peggy.folinsbee@gmail.com

Parks for Paws? Rules for Walking Dogs in Edmonton

Your pet must be on a leash when you are not in your yard. Use a leash on any parkland trail more than 0.5 metres wide and on city boulevards. But remember, even on these trails, keep dogs at least 10 meters away from:

School grounds
Sports fields
Golf courses
Off trail outside off leash area boundaries
Playgrounds
Picnic sites
Park buildings and facilities
Off trail inside community league parks

With those restrictions, where can I go with my dog off-leash?



Off-Leash Sites

Edmonton has 40 sites where your dog can run and play without a leash. Some off-leash areas are in river valley parks, some are on undeveloped land, and still others are in neighbourhood parks. All sites have boundaries, but are not fenced. Area maps with boundaries are posted at each site and on the internet at www.edmonton.ca/parks Remember to keep your dog on leash when coming and going from off-leash sites.

Beware of School Zones


At this time of the year, parks and schools see a noticeable increase in children and families. As always, adhere to speed markers.

Most schools lack parking zones in their front areas and parents and guardians are reminded this is done for a specific reason: to assist with view lines for crossing children. Please be cognizant of the signage in your area and respect it. It can an inconvenience during cold weather, however we ask that you park safely and appropriately, walking your children to the school doors.

In addition, there are big yellow buses! Community members, emergency responders, parents/guardians and teachers are kindly asked to help educate kids on the importance of traffic safety. If an item or a knapsack is dropped, remind children to let an adult know and not run into the roadway. Buses have many blind spots and if you can't see the driver they likely can't see you.

In addition, drivers are reminded that failing to reduce your speed when approaching a school bus from the front/rear/passenger side if the amber lights are flashing can result in a \$345.00 penalty.


South Campus Update

The University asks for neighbours' cooperation

In recent weeks, plants and crops on the farm property have been removed and vegetation disrupted. The University seeks to remind those who take advantage of South Campus lands to respect the integrity of the research taking place by abiding by the following regulations:

- · Remain on the trails and grass pathways.
- Ensure dogs are on their leash at all times.
- Do not interfere with any plants or crops.

The South Campus research lands are restricted areas and public vehicle access is not permitted. Campus Protective Services are patrolling the premises. Let's try to ensure that the U keeps its gates open, so we can all enjoy access to the farmlands.

South Campus Neighbourhood Coalition report

The focus in the past year was on:

63rd Avenue Access. As long as the wetlands disturbance permit application proceeds smoothly, construction should begin in Spring 2014, and the access should be functional (even if not completely finished) by October 2014.

LRDP Amendment. Please see our website for our letter that was submitted to UA Board of Governors regarding our concerns (traffic volume and parking being central among these). Following the Board of Governors rather rubber stamp approval, we shared these concerns with the Minister for Advanced Education (the help of MLA Steve Young should be noted here) who has to give final sign-off on these Amendments.

This year's focus is likely to be on the nature of Michener Park developments. At a recent meeting the University announced that it was considering leasing out two parcels of Michener Park land representing nearly a third of the existing site in order to offset development costs. This is on top of the recent approval for 470 units on the adjacent Golflands also leased by the University; a density Westcorp claims is necessary for viability.

The initial plan was to double the density of Michener Park from 386 units to 780 units. Two new leases would introduce two additional planning processes separate from the Michener Park sector plan. If the density sought by Westcorp was to be applied to the potential lease areas, it would represent an additional thousand units!

We all understand the need for residential infill in mature neighbourhoods. However, we can also understand Malmo's bewilderment at the prospects of excessive density change that has major implications for the nature of its community.

This provides another illustration of the need for more effective liaison with both University and City in order to pursue our goal of promoting "fully liveable communities". Rather than simply looking at one land parcel, it is important to consider the bigger picture. One example would be the extent to which Michener shops could impact the prospects of a revitalized Lansdowne Mall, in event of Safeway's restrictive covenant ending with Sobey's takeover.

Other current targets include:

Administer a survey of the eight communities, to be completed during the Fall either electronically or on paper. See below.

Revamp our website, and update our Position Paper: providing clear context for our issues.

Consult with U to foster a more trusting climate where ideas and alternative options can be floated and discussed. We need to move beyond simply being a conduit for University information, dealing only with already-made decisions.

Question the appropriateness of the U's exemption from municipal bylaws allowed by the Postsecondary Education Act; especially in light of the precedent set by the University of Calgary's Engagement Charter regarding consultation in the planning process.

Explore the implications of the revenue-generating land leases that could potentially become a central element of other South Campus development (e.g. the West 240); likely to be designated through a development-by-development approach, not as a part of any broader, cohesive plan. This would be a far cry from planning that is visionary, accountable, and coordinated so that the cumulative impacts of these developments will be serviced by roads, paths, schools and social infrastructure ensuring that our area remains a desirable place to live.

We wish to acknowledge the support given to the SCNC by outgoing Councillor Don Iveson, and wish him every success in his future endeavours!

As municipal candidates come to your door, consider asking them about how they see the City's role in influencing the University's development of South Campus.

If you have concerns regarding South Campus and decide to contact the City or U, please consider cc'ing your SCNC representative so that the community league is more aware of neighbourhood feelings and action.

Lendrum-specific concerns

So far Lendrum has borne the brunt of almost all the additional traffic brought about by South Campus development. The 63rd Avenue access (from 122nd Street that will hopefully be functional by October 2014) will provide necessary reprieve to our neighbourhood in the short term. However, more needs to be done to look after Lendrum's interests as South Campus development continues. This includes requiring the U to take clear steps to prevent cross-campus traffic.

Suggestion #1: The bus access to the South Campus LRT station will eventually be expanded to accommodate some student parking once residences get built there. Is there any role for so-called "kiss and ride" traffic to use this road, and thus divert some traffic flow from Lendrum?

City response: The South Campus Transit Centre is designed to accommodate transfer between bus and rail, not a large turnover of kiss and ride activity. As more development occurs surrounding the Transit Centre, it will become less accessible to traffic. There are expectations for future walk up users resulting from expansion of South Campus and Neil Crawford buildings. The site is expected to function much the same as the one on 89 Avenue within the North Campus by Hub Mall.

Suggestion #2: Lendrum residents near 60th Avenue have been more accepting of traffic accessing South Campus than 115 Street residents who continue to complain about traffic volumes during peak am/pm times and (given the increasing frequency of tournaments of one form or another) weekends. The idea was put forward to make the north end of 115 Street into a cul-de-sac for a trial period to determine the extent of knock-on impact on 114th Street (nothing is gained if this simply relocates the problem through additional traffic going past Lendrum schools).

City response: Contact the group within the City that assesses a whole neighbourhood to identify traffic mitigation possibilities.

Suggestion #3: Can a Restricted Residential Parking Program parking be introduced at the north end of 115th Street, say one hour parking between 10am and 1pm on weekdays?

My response: Parking on this street has abruptly got worse in September since the U started monitoring its parking lots around the Go Centre. Some people feel that parked cars serve to slow traffic, others object to cars always parked in front of their house whenever the U is in session. If sufficient people are interested in pursuing a parking restriction, the Community League could undertake a poll of residents within this section of the neighbourhood. I believe two thirds support would be needed.


Lendrum Community Camping under the Stars 2013


