Safety around snow windrows and snow removal equipment

With the accumulation of snow, City of Edmonton crews are out clearing and sanding roadways on a regular basis, and it is important that pedestrians and motorists stay safe.

Windrow safety – Windrows can be dangerous. It is easy to slip and fall off of an icy windrow and into the path of a vehicle. Around schools and playgrounds, children should cross the street only at corners. Parents dropping children off or picking them up from school should only do so in cleared drop-off zones established by the school. It is illegal to park outside the windrow if doing so narrows the driving lane and restricts the flow of traffic. Drivers who do so are subject to a fine.

Around snow removal equipment – While driving, please give winter road maintenance equipment a wide berth when approaching/passing. Following too close, cutting off equipment in traffic and trying to pass when unsafe to do so, can result in significant damage to vehicles and lead to injury for both the operator and the driver of the other vehicle. Give crews lots of room to do their work so that everyone stays safe on the roads.

Winter driving tips – Drivers are reminded that although roads are plowed and sanded, driving to the current road conditions is their responsibility. Please allow for extra time to arrive at your destination. Leave sufficient room between yourself and the vehicle in front of you for braking. Watch for pedestrians and other vehicles around windrows.

South Campus Update

New Access: Construction of the 63 Avenue Access is proceeding as planned: mainly tree clearing so far, but some construction is due to begin in March. Concerns have been expressed about construction traffic adding to Lendrum's woes, but the U is planning for the bulk of this to access the campus via 122nd Street. Temporary cross-walk and ETS bus stop likely to be at 62 Avenue; safety concerns are being discussed for pedestrians/students going to and fro South Campus LRT on the gravel track used by farm vehicles. There will be some lane restrictions on 122nd Street over the summer months. U will start distributed monthly e-updates beginning in early February; these will be posted on Ledrum's website. Lendrum has asked about cross-campus short-cutting; the U says this will be assessed as need arises, with possibility of fob-operated barriers.

Arenas: U has begun discussion with the City regarding the possibility of partnership over the twin ice arenas; but these are at a very tentative stage. The Department of Physical Education is also seeking other funding partners. SCNC has expressed strong concerns about that additional traffic/parking that this will cause, and the U has committed to build the parkade (identified in the LRDP) in conjunction with the building of the arenas.

<u>Michener Park</u>: focus group meetings have begun again targeting late March for an Open House on the Sector Plan.

Parking in Lendrum: Parasitic parking by LRT passengers continues to be a concern for residents at the north end of 115 Street, and in southeast Lendrum by Southgate. While I hope that the traffic volume through Lendrum will be diluted with the opening of the 63rd Avenue Access, parking is likely to remain a problem. I hope to explore the possibility of a public meeting in the spring, ideally with a City Transportation representative in attendance so that options can be discussed. Alcohol & Pregnancy: Help Spread the Facts!



Many Albertans know someone who has a Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder (FASD) and most are aware of this preventable birth defect. FASD is a lifelong disability resulting from prenatal exposure to alcohol that has no cure. People with an FASD can have a combination of unique physical, developmental, learning and behaviour problems and concerns.

Yet 9% of Alberta women reported drinking during their last pregnancy. Some may be surprised the percentage is markedly higher (41%) for women in the highest income group. Among Alberta women 18 to 44 years of age, 80% reported drinking within the past 12 months. Given that 50% of pregnancies are reported to be unplanned, a significant number of unborn babies are at a high risk of prenatal exposure to alcohol

No wonder why women, their partners, family and friends are confused about alcohol use and pregnancy, there are myths and misinformation everywhere! From authors, health care providers to well intentioned friends, conflicting and inaccurate information is being spread to women.

What we do know is that no woman consumes alcohol wanting to cause harm to her baby. A woman may not know she is pregnant, may not be aware of the effects on fetal development. Life circumstances past and present, such as domestic violence, poverty, mental health problems and stress can result in alcohol use as a coping strategy. And all women, all ages and all socioeconomic backgrounds may drink alcohol during pregnancy because it is their social norm and loved ones around them drink on a regular basis.

So what can we do? Help spread the facts by having non-judgemental prevention conversations with family, friends, colleagues and the community at large about alcohol use and pregnancy.

Drinking can be harmful at any point during pregnancy and can result in lifelong disabilities.

Alcohol and pregnancy don't mix. If you drink alcohol and are sexually active, make sure you use contraception.

Friends, partners and family members can support a woman by asking how they can help her to make healthy choices for healthy babies.

Some women need support, care and treatment to help them stop drinking during pregnancy.
