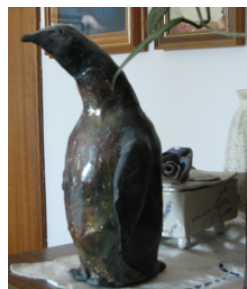

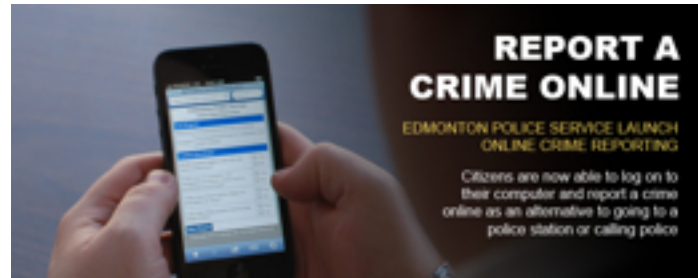

Partner with EPS: be our neighborhood eyes and ears!

Unfortunately, EPS patrol can't be everywhere at all times, so we're looking for your help. Follow the few simple tips below to help us keep your property and community safe!

Suspicious activity? Report it.

See someone suspicious hanging around in your neighbourhood trying door handles on vehicles, going through yards, or perhaps coming to your door with a story that just doesn't ring true? Please record as many details as you can and report it to the EPS.

Secure your home

Practicing good home security is also helpful. Ensure your doors and windows are secure, and leave an exterior and interior light on if you're planning to be away during evening hours. If you're away for the weekend or an extended period of time, consider stopping your paper and mail delivery and ask a friend or neighbor to check on your home regularly.

Remove all valuables from your vehicle

Finally, please REMOVE ALL PROPERTY from your vehicles and lock your vehicle doors. This will help prevent theft from autos.

The EPS is always available to assist you. If you have any concerns about suspicious activity in your neighbourhood, don't hesitate to call the complaint line at 780-423-4567. If you believe a crime is **in progress**, call 911.

Lendrum PARKING CONCERNS

With the development of sports facilities and a LRT station on South Campus, Lendrum has suffered from a significantly increased volume of traffic going through our neighbourhood, and increased amounts of "parasitic" parking. Residents living on 115th Street have expressed the most discontent about this and there seem to be growing demand for some sort of change.

The hope is that traffic volumes will decrease when an additional South Campus access is opened in October 2014 from 122nd Street at 63rd Avenue. In contrast, the parking problems are likely to be here to stay and need to be addressed by working with representatives from the City of Edmonton. Finding a solution is problematic since the answer to one problem can be the cause of another. To be successful in seeking change, there needs to be broad agreement within the neighbourhood.

One proposal is to prevent parking on one side of the street, partly based on the fact that 115th Street is a bike route and there can be significant danger where cars are parked on both sides and a cyclist confronts oncoming traffic.

East-side only parking would be likely to significantly inconvenience residents in at least the two blocks at the north end of 115th Street, and has the potential to push parking onto adjacent streets.

Another proposal is to follow the pattern of neighbourhoods surrounding North Campus and allow residents-only parking, with each vehicle needing to display a parking permit.

All residents within a specified number of blocks from South Campus entrance, and their visitors would have to display a permit or run the risk of being fined.

Thirdly, to introduce time restrictions on parking. For example, a Monday-Friday two-hour limit during working hours since this would impact drivers who use 115th Street as a substitute for the park-and-ride lots around the Saville Centre.

I think this will involve petitioning the City, so should only go ahead if it receives broad support from the residents of 115th Street who would be most effected.

Please let me know which of these options you would support. And, whether you would be interesting in attending a public meeting about the options if one was held in (say) March, ideally with a City Transportation representative in attendance.

What is it? A systematic way to understand our neighbors and help create connections with the neighborhood

Why? To make Lendrum a vibrant place to live. To help one another. To keep Lendrum a safe place to live. To have a lot of fun.

How does it work? A coordinator helps "connectors" do a short survey about the community and about residents wants, needs and desires for the neighborhood. This is entered into a database and then we help connect neighbors with similar interests or those with skills to those with needs.

When is this happening? Now! Expect a knock on your door in the next 2-3 months to do the survey. It only takes about 20 minutes.

How can I help? 1. Do the survey. 2. We will need a host of volunteers - one on every block or 2 - to do the surveys

Lendrum Playground Re-development Fundraisers

Message to the Community from the Playground Committee

After much consideration, the Playground Committee has been recommended to break the playground redevelopment project in 2 phases instead of doing it all at the same time. The City has assisted us in revising our plans to redevelop the playground in spring 2015 and the spray park in spring 2016.

We have fundraised up a storm this year including Sobeys and Salisbury gift cards, book sale, raffle, freezie sales, Concession for the Canada Day Bike Race, garage sale, Pennies for the Playground, campout and a New Year's celebration. Thanks to all our hard working fabulous volunteers we have raised about \$30,000. Watch for our awesome fundraising events this spring!

Community members have been extremely generous making private donations. We are so lucky to live in a community where community members believe so strongly in their community and have donated over \$20,000. If you've been thinking to make a donation to the playground but haven't gotten around to it, now is a great time!!!

Grants make up much of the funding for these projects and we have been writing grants like crazy: NPDP, CFEP, Community Spirit grant, and the Community Play Spaces and we have many others to go! We have just received conditional approval for the big grant, the NPDP, in the amount of \$250,000 for the playground and \$125,000 for the spray park. Approval is conditional on 1) City Council approving continued funding for the NPDP in Dec 2014, 2) all partnership funding being received by April 1, 2015 and 3) AGLC approval of using gaming proceeds for this project.

Committee members have put in an exceptionally dedicated effort over the past four years. Exciting projects like this need growing support from the community and from future playground users, especially going into Phase 2. To keep the momentum growing, we need new Committee members and volunteers to join the fun!

Message from Councillor Michael Walters: 150 Days Update

It seems hard to believe, but as of March 20th, I've been in office for 150 days - almost half a year. The past few months seem like a blur, and for good reason: there's been a lot going on!

During the campaign, I made a number of commitments to you. I'm happy to say that I've already taken action on the most pressing issues, and I'm making progress on others. I'd like to note in particular a couple of accomplishments:

At the February 5, 2014 meeting of Transportation Committee, I put forward a motion, which passed unanimously, asking Administration to look at possible alternatives for existing lanes and to provide a meaningful five-year implementation plan for new lanes. I'm excited to find ways that bike lanes can work better for Edmontonians.

Many people in the neighbourhood of Skyrattler expressed serious concerns about a First Place Housing development on their park - a small park in an already dense neighbourhood. It's clear that this particular site requires better engagement and more consideration, so on February 18, Executive Committee deferred this site to the last phase of the program. We need to think of ways to make infill housing work in mature neighbourhoods, but we also need to listen to those neighbourhoods more effectively.

In addition to those specific accomplishments, I've also spent countless hours in Council and committee meetings - my role as Vice Chair of Transportation Committee keeps me particularly busy. I also sit on the Capital Region Board's Regional Transit Taskforce and the board of the River Valley Alliance.

All that aside, my favourite part of this job is meeting with engaged citizens. So many of you have great ideas about how we can build our city differently, and I'm grateful to you for taking the time to share those ideas and keep me informed about the issues your communities face.
