

Message from Councillor Michael Walters:

Welcome to Spring (hopefully)!

It was another long winter here in Edmonton and, as usual, we survived. We are ready to welcome spring and to look forward to a summer filled with festivals and hot weather. As we move into spring here at city hall we will keep a little bit of winter with us. At our May 21 Transportation Committee we will be discussing and improving our snow and ice control policy. I will be pushing for improvements to snow clearing and windrow removal on streets adjacent to schools. We are reviewing the whole policy and, as a council with six newcomers, there will be a lot of new ideas about how to make it better.

Oh., and potholes!

City council will continue to invest in road repairs this year and voted on April 15 to add an additional \$27 million into the Arterial Road Rehabilitation program for 2014. As citizens you are the eyes out there so please alert 311 to any potholes that need attention.

Infill and public transit

There are two very important policy discussions underway at City Hall. Council is deliberating over a review of Edmonton Transit and how we can expand and improve the system within Edmonton. I am also part of a regional conversation about how best to provide public transit across the region.

As we expand transit we also have to consider our growth as a city. With over 500,000 people expected to move to Edmonton in the coming 20-30 years we have real questions to ask about where they all will live. I am committed to starting a larger conversation about infill and increased density to counter rapid outward expansion. The Lendrum Abundant Community Initiative

What makes a great neighbourhood? Have you ever thought of that question?

As a Lendrum community member you will get the opportunity to answer these questions through the City of Edmonton's **Abundant Community Initiative**.

We know that in general Edmontonians place a high value on river valley access, playgrounds, parks, and walkability. We have that and more in Lendrum: we have great people! For the past 16+ years my wife & I (& kids!) have had the privilege of seeing that truth borne out in Lendrum over & over again.

Sociologist John McKnight, co-author of, **'The Abundant Community'** says, "Building community is more than occasional, tangible events like holding picnics or doing a group service project. It involves the more fundamental tasks of rearing a child, promoting health, and keeping the streets safe. To fulfill these functions in a satisfying way, a community needs certain properties. A competent (Abundant) Community has three properties":

- 1. Focus on the gifts of neighbours.
- 2. Nurture associational life activities and interests that neighbours might do together.
- 3. Offer hospitality, the welcoming of strangers.
- 1. In order to "focus on the gifts" of our neighbourhood, in the next few months we would like to find out about you & your household's visions and dreams for our neighbourhood; the passions and pastimes which occupy you; and the gifts, abilities, and experiences your household possesses. To do this we want you to make these a topic of conversation with a neighbour who will be contacting you as your 'Block Connector.' They will come equipped to your home with a "Lendrum Conversation Guide" for a casual 10 minute interview.
- 2. As a way to "nurture associational life" within the neighbourhood we will be renewing our effort to inform neighbours of others with common interests or complementary gifts. There are gifts, skills, and experiences that neighbours are willing to share with others. Such skills include basic computer operation, playing guitar, road biking, yoga & many, many more. Experiences include immigrating, parenting, and illness. This is your chance to tell us who you are and what makes you tick.
- 3. As a neighbourhood we want to continue the kindness that encourages people to **be open and hospitable**. We welcome the gifts of neighbours previously unknown into our community. No one should feel the pressure to join, but we want everyone to receive the invitation to belong.



122 Street Access to University South Campus

The foundation is dug for a major west-side entrance to South Campus from 122nd street. The road will go to the Saville Centre. The university plans to complete this entrance by September 2014.

<u>Parking</u>

The last Lendrum newsletter listed three proposals for addressing LRT and Savilleevent parking. Three people wrote emails supporting parking restrictions. The city plans to undertake a parking survey in north-west Lendrum in Fall 2014.

Traffic

The city undertook a traffic count at the 60th avenue and 115th street intersection during the spring and concluded short cutting is not an issue in Lendrum.

Lendrum Nature News

It feels like it's been a long time coming after the "winter-that-would-not-end", but there have been promising signs of spring over the last month. The Canada Geese were some of the first migrants back as there is stiff competition to occupy the best nest sites. In the spring and fall many of them spend time at the University Farm gleaning dropped grain. Gulls and crows usually arrive near the equinox, March 21st but were late this year, as were the robins - almost three weeks later than usual. Even the dandelions were late blooming! However there is hope, one sees new grass coming up through last year's dry remnants and the poplars have broken dormancy, some of the early clones have leaves.

It would appear the meadow voles have enjoyed good health due to the deep snow, judging by the tunnels through our lawns and gardens. Check out the following for more information. http://www.edmontonjournal.com/Fresh+Greens+Pesky+moles+thrive+long+snowy+winters/9766949/story.html

Our local white-tailed prairie hare population has also done well and their young ones will be hidden under shrubs. Remember, if you find a young rabbit, or any other young animal, it is almost always better to leave them alone as the mother will be returning to feed it. Once again there are merlins nesting in the area. These are small falcons with blue-gray backs and white to pale brown undersides with some streaking. They have a very loud cackle that sounds like "klee-klee-klee". We enjoyed seeing huge flocks of bohemian waxwings that swirled around the tree tops this past winter enjoying last year's crabapples and mountain ash berries.



Despite the addition of entrance restrictors on the bird houses, house sparrows have moved in to some of them. The good news is we spotted a tree swallow swooping through the natural area checking out the nest boxes! This is great news for soccer players and their parents because they eat mosquitos. These are small birds with pointy wings and a forked tail, with a beautiful iridescent blue-green back and white belly.

Last summer the city contracted to have four sections of the naturalized area planted with more native plants. These included a small section of

tall grass prairie near the amphitheatre, a larger section just below the gravel path in the small grass prairie and two sections of wet meadow near the drain by 113 A. Street. We are happy to see many of these plants have come through the winter and are looking very healthy.

On August 6th, we'll be hosting a Family Nature Night organized by the Young Naturalists Club of Nature Alberta and the City of Edmonton. We will be showing off the native plants in the natural area, playing some games and doing a craft. More details to follow.

It's always great to see so many people out enjoying our wonderful park, please remember to take your snack wrappers and recyclables to the nearest trash can.


