# **Civics**



### Parking Limits Proposed For North Lendrum – Your Thoughts Are Welcome

Every workday 40 to 60 drivers park on or near 115th Street between 58th Avenue and 60th Avenue. The parking starts at 7:30 am and goes to 5:30 pm. The drivers park and go to the LRT. The parking is an intrusion on a once quiet street. The LRT-associated parking might expand to other parts of the community as the LRT expands.

The Lendrum Community League board will ask the City to consider one of two parking-limit options for Lendrum. The two options are as follows:

*Option 1:* A parking restriction on the east side of 115th Street from 58th Avenue to 60th Avenue. The restriction will allow 2 hour parking from 9 am to 4 pm on weekdays. With such a small parking restriction, residents do not get special parking permits. They must respect the restriction. The restriction can be expanded on a block-by-block basis if the LRT-associated parking expands to adjacent streets. *Option 2:* A parking program for areas north of and including 56th Avenue and west of 113th Street. 60th Avenue would not be included. The west side of 115th Street is not included. All residents get as many non-transferable parking permits as they have cars registered to their address. Residents can apply for visitor permits. Persons without permits can park for 2 hours between 8 am and 6 pm on weekdays.

Option 1 and 2 require that 66% of the residents in the parking zones agree in writing. Option 1 is a short-term solution. However, if the parking issue gets larger, Option 1 can be an interim step to a larger parking program.

### **Playground Redevelopment**

Coming out of the City of Edmonton's budget discussions in December, we are happy to report that Lendrum has been officially approved for a Neighbourhood Parks and Development Program grant of \$250,000, the maximum allowed! Now, we await word about the **Community Facilities Enhancement Program** grant, from which we have requested \$125,000. It's the last cornerstone piece in our funding, and again, if you get the chance, please let our MLA Steve Young know Lendrum needs this grant, and anything he could do to encourage the Minister in charge about this would be very helpful indeed. We are also working on a final design for the playground with our chosen playground supplier, Park N Play. The City would like to see a final design by the end of January so we aren't able to do as much community consultation as we'd like to, but we've been listening to you for the past 5 years and we know what Lendrum wants. Please know we are working on something that will set our playground apart, and we are hoping to unveil the design at a community event soon... Many thanks again for your continued support!

# Lendrum Abundant Community Initiative

Many of us belong to lots of different kinds of clubs, groups and associations. Each is held together by a common gift, skill, interest or passion. Choirs are associations that magnify the gifts of people who sing well (or enjoy singing). Athletic teams collect people together with sports skills.

Whatever the group, the "glue" that holds it together is whatever the members have in common — something important enough to lead them to join and actively participate.

When we consider the neighbourhood & more specifically our block, if it is organized it is because something in common leads people to want to come together. Where blocks are not organized, it is because neighbours don't know what they share or have in common. Just living on the same block is not enough to pull many people out of their houses to join with neighbours (except perhaps for an annual block party). One step up is the block club created to deal with crime, safety and security. But that is a community drawn together only by fear — creating a fortress mentality.

There are some neighbourhoods, however, drawn together because they have discovered the gifts, skills, interests and passions of their fellow residents. This knowledge is the catalyst for all kinds of new relationships. The connections may be between two neighbours who discover a mutual interest in yoga. Or it may be several neighbours with an interest in gardening. Or it may be all the neighbours who discover their common interest in being a village that raises a child.

Whenever a neighbourhood comes together in powerful and satisfying ways, it is because two things have happened. First, they have found out about each other's gifts. Second, they have made new connections based on these gifts. It is the sum of these connections that "glues" a neighbourhood together. (JMcKnight)

To that end we are looking for people who understand and value neighbourly relationships & who have a knack for making friends and acquaintances to help us with our Lendrum Abundant Community Initiative. Our hope is to find a Block Connector for every block in Lendrum.

### Kathy's Easy Slow Cooker White Chili

6 boneless, skinless chicken breasts (or use thighs & breasts) chili powder, cumin 3 celery sticks, 1 small onion, 2 small jalapeno/serrano peppers, chopped 1 can of whole mushrooms, drained (or use fresh mushrooms) 1 c frozen corn, white or yellow, thawed 1 can white kidney beans 2 jars President's Choice Roasted Garlic Alfredo Sauce (or use 3 c homemade Alfredo sauce/white sauce plus parmesan)

Brown chicken in non-stick fry pan in a bit of olive oil. Sprinkled with chili powder and cumin as they brown. Transfer to crockpot & chop into bite-sized chunks with food scissors. Now brown celery, onion, peppers & mushrooms and transfer them too. Dump in the beans (with liquid) corn and sauce. Cook on low all day, adjust seasoning with salt, pepper & hot sauce. Enjoy!
