Upcoming AGM is April 13th, 6:30 – 9:00. We start with half hour social time and then move into the business of reviewing reports and electing officials. All reports will be available online at www.lendrum. org. And a small number of printed copies will be on hand at the meeting. Message from Councillor Walters

A Compact City is an Affordable City

Edmontonians almost universally agree we need to build a more compact city. We expect a population of 1.4 million in Edmonton by 2044. We need to plan for this today. Since September, I've been engaging with Ward 10 residents regarding infill, the future of our neighbourhoods and their special characteristics.

On November 12th, the City Administration forwarded a proposal to amend zoning bylaws to allow for incremental density increases in all neighbourhoods across the City. This proposal will be discussed at the March 16th public hearing.

Current Regulations

A lot 78 ft. wide or greater can be subdivided. Garage/garden suites can be on a corner site, abut a service road, or back onto a lane adjacent to an arterial roadway, and must be narrower than the main structure.Secondary suites can be built on most lots. Semi-detached housing can be built on corner lots as a discretionary use.

Proposed Changes

The proposed changes are within existing RF1 zoning, for which allows for single-detached homes, secondary suites, and semi-detached or duplex homes in limited circumstances. Full scale change from RF1 to RF3 (which includes townhomes, walk-up apartments, and other housing types) is NOT being proposed.

- 1. In the proposal, minimum lot width is reduced from 39 ft to 25 ft, allowing the subdivision of 50 ft lots into two 25 ft lots, with some exceptions.
- 2. Garden and garage suites could be constructed on any lot with access to a rear lane.

There are no proposals to develop existing green spaces. It is important that only one of a subdivision, secondary suite or garage/garden suite would be permitted on any lot - not in combination. Citizens can register to speak at the public hearing through the City's website. Parking Program In North West Lendrum

Lendrum Community League is pursuing a residential parking program for north-west Lendrum. The proposed program is described as Option 2 in the January 2015 newsletter. The City will implement the program if 66% of the residents in Lendrum's north-west approve.

In March, each house in the affected area will get a notice explaining why a parking program might benefit north-west Lendrum's residents. In April, volunteers will start visiting each household and ask whether an adult is willing sign a letter supporting the program.

A residential parking program allows residents to park on the street if their cars are registered to their house and if their cars have a residential parking sticker. Residential parking stickers are free. Residents can also ask for short-term visitor stickers. Non-residents can park for 2 hours between 8am and 6pm on weekdays. University of Alberta Farm Land Trust

In February 2015, the Alberta Government created a land trust to manage the University of Alberta's undeveloped properties. A key asset is the university farm.

The land trust was created at the University's request but is run independently of the University. All profits of the trust go to the University. The land trust must develop the university farm according to the established, governmentapproved Long Range Development Plan. The Long Range Development Plan can be modified if the University consults Lendrum residents and other impacted communities.



Park Redevelopment


The Playground Committee is very pleased to announce that we have unanimously agreed to a funding deal brokered by City of Edmonton Project Manager Michele Finn. We were awarded a \$250,000 Neighbourhood Park Development Program grant from the City last fall. We have decided to use \$200,000 of that grant this year for the playground, and \$50,000 sometime in the next 3 years for the park furniture and new gazebo development.

Currently, we are also awaiting official confirmation of an expected \$109,000 Community Facilities Enhancement Fund grant from the province. We have verbal confirmation of the amount from MLA Steve Young and he says he will look into the expected arrival date of the CFEP grant funds. We hope to have the CFEP funds in place by April 1st, or else it will delay construction. In the meantime, we have put the final touches on our playground design, which is being handled by Park N Play. The plan, once approved, will be unveiled to the community on the website and newsletter in the spring. We would also like to take this opportunity to thank the community for their continued support.

Next Steps:

Mid-April: Equipment approvals all done and finalized (by committee and then the City) Late June: City releases tenders Mid-July: Construction September: Playground's Grand Opening



The volunteer gardeners at the Green & Gold Community garden, on the University of Alberta South Campus, are making plans for our seventh gardening season! The garden is an initiative of the University's School of Public Health and Faculty of Agricultural, Life and Environmental Sciences. The garden is totally volunteer run; virtually all of the seeds, plants and equipment used are donated.

The vegetables, herbs and flowers are "spray-free" (no pesticides or artificial fertilizers are used). Anyone is welcome to 'purchase' their vegetables at the garden and all of the money raised – that's 100% – goes to the **Tubahumurize Association**, a non-profit organization in Rwanda that provides socially and economically marginalized women with vocational training, counselling, life-skills coaching, health care education, and opportunities for sustainable income generating activities. Most individuals who benefit from Tubahumurize are genocide survivors and many are widows or orphans, HIV infected, and survivors of physical and sexual violence. To date, the garden has raised over \$100,000 for the Tubahumurize project.

We are now gearing up for the 2015 gardening season, and are looking for new volunteers to join us at the garden. Both novice & experienced gardeners are welcome. Theft from Vehicles

Theft from vehicles is an opportunity based crime and offenders target easy vehicles. This crime type can be prevented.

Some simple tips to prevent theft from your vehicle:

- Remove all valuables (backpacks, cell phones, purses, wallets, sunglasses, GPS systems, keys, iPod', shopping bags, cigarettes, etc) from your vehicle.
- If you must keep valuables in your vehicle, store them in your trunk.
- Never leave a spare vehicle or house key in your vehicle.
- Whenever possible, park your vehicle in your garage.
- Lock your doors, and roll up your windows completely when you park.
- Protect your insurance and registration documents as well as your garage door opener. (Carry them in your wallet or conceal them).
- If your garage door opener is stolen, ensure you change your system code.
- Install a car alarm, or use "the club" to lock the steering wheel.
- Use locking screws for your license plate.

Your best weapon is your brain. Use common sense, imagination, and good judgment.
