Watch the Lendrum Soccer Teams in action in pick-up games throughout the afternoon. Soccer team medals will be presented at 3pm.

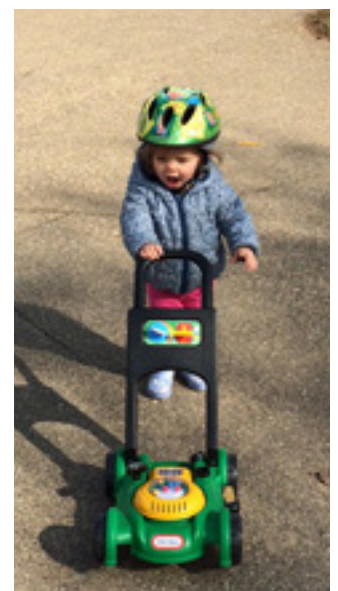

Civics

Parking

Canvassing continues for the residential parking program in northwest Lendrum. Sixty-four people have signed a petition saying yes. Seventeen have said no, 14 said maybe, 6 houses appear to be empty at the moment and 38 residents have yet to be contacted. Twenty-eight more signatures are needed for the program to proceed.

One resident asked why the University didn't build a large park and ride facility on the farm. The external relations office of the University says most local communities have asked the University not to build a park-and-ride on the farm. The University is building a 200 car lot near the station but this lot is for permitted University parking.

University Farm

Compost is now available on the University farm across from the dairy barn. The University will be paving the road that runs between the northwest corner of the Saville Centre and the cyclotron facility in the near future. The University is planning a hockey arena for the same area.

The planning for the arena is in the earliest stages and the University is looking for financial partners. The University is also planning a large book storage facility to be built between Lendrum and the Saville Centre.

Infill

The city approved the new infill bylaws allowing the subdivision of 50 foot lots without an application for a variance. Councillor Walters was informed that Lendrum residents are concerned that parking, traffic, poor construction, and aesthetics can be an issue with infill. The community hopes that the City proactively addresses these potential nuisance factors.

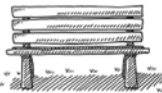

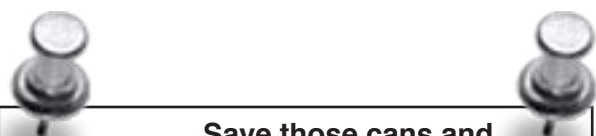

Abundant Community

Hello neighbours!

Winter can often cause us to hibernate – but now it's great to see everyone emerging back out and about in the neighbourhood! Something has sprung! Here are some quick updates on a brand new season of connecting neighbours with neighbours, a.k.a the Lendrum Abundant Community Initiative:

First, when prolific author, leadership guru & community organizer Margaret Wheatley was in town recently (sponsored by the Edmonton Public Library) to speak to Community Connectors & Block Connectors from all over Edmonton, she graciously drew us all into a circle for a conversation instead. It was no surprise from a woman who says, *'Trust that meaningful conversations can change your world.'*

What a great reminder that, **'Whatever the problem, community is the answer!'**

Expect someone to be stopping by to initiate a conversation to find out about your visions and dreams for our little neighbourhood, the passions and pastimes which occupy you, and the gifts, abilities and experiences your household possesses. We would love for you to talk about this with a neighbour. Some neighbours have already stepped forward to help initiate these conversations & we call them Block Connectors. No one should feel the pressure to join, but we want everyone to receive the invitation to belong.

Second, we have a big hairy, audacious goal that by the end of June we would attempt to have a block party on EVERY block in Lendrum!

Fourth, this little neighbouring initiative we are a part of has captured the attention of many other neighbourhoods and even municipalities. While what we are doing may seem insignificant at times, the long-term implications appear to be very significant. Author, consultant, & speaker on organizational development, community building & civic engagement, Peter Block has written a letter speaking to this:

The work of the Abundant Community Initiative (ACI) is vital to the well-being of our cities. Every city is concerned about our health, children, safety, the land, the local economy and those on the margins. Government policies and social services are at their limits. The next wave of impact will come from citizens connected to their neighbours engaged in bringing their gifts and humanity to each other. This social capital is what keeps us healthy, what raises our children, holds us safe

and keeps dollars circulating locally. Every health care worker, educator, police chief and economist that is paying attention knows this is true. That is why citizen engagement is on all their agendas.

The Abundant Community Initiative is using local people to activate the engagement, not outside experts or professionals. This keeps the effort grounded and imprints the message that neighbours have the capacity to create their own future. Finally, and most importantly, it is changing the narrative of who we are as citizens. The dominant story in the public mind is about what is wrong with us. That people are simply a collection of needs and deficiencies. How little schooled we are, how un-employed we are, how much mischief we are in. Building a development strategy on deficiencies only magnifies and amplifies what it tries to heal. This effort is gift-based. It values citizens as capacities; people able to teach each other, produce experiences with each other, raise each other's children. These are life changing.

The Abundant Community Initiative is part of a large movement that is neighborhood focused, citizen centered and gift based. Each of these is fragile, underfunded, and learning as it goes. This is the nature of the best innovations. The difficulty with them is that they are not easily scaled, hard to measure except anecdotally, lack bricks and mortar, and don't feed the investigative appetite of the news. The blessing is that it is the only strategy that works. Plus it is good for democracy.

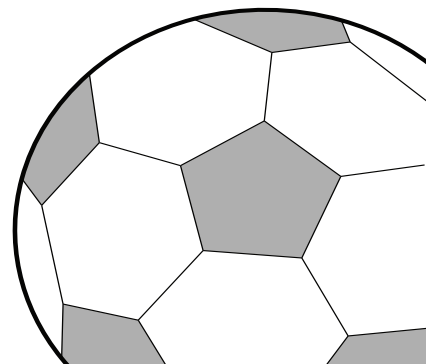

Park Redevelopment

The Lendrum Park Redevelopment Committee is pleased to present the final design for the new playground! Our new playground is nature themed, featuring a custom tree play structure, tree climbers and stumps, a disc swing, a chrysalis spinner, a rock climbing volcano wall, spinning leaf seats, a double slide and an enormous bee complete with honeycomb climber!

The cost of the playground phase is \$440,000, of which \$47,000 was contributed by Lendrum Community League and an amazing \$62,000 from the community in the form of private donations and community fundraising! Construction should begin this July.

Gazebo Phase

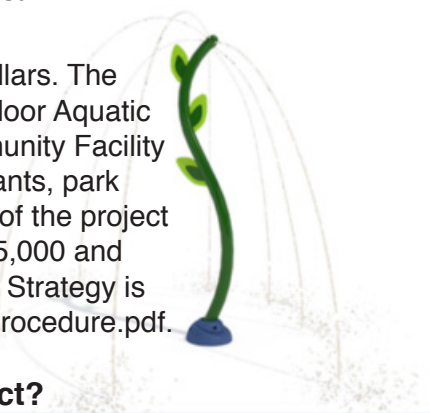
We have secured 78k (50k from the City + 28k from the Community League) of the 100k needed for the new gazebo, benches and picnic tables. Because a new sun-shade structure is required for our park and because the City is saving 50k for up to 3 years for this phase, fundraising the remaining 22k will be our priority.

Spray Park Phase



Lendrum is a growing, vibrant neighbourhood with and near many desirable amenities including Lendrum Park. A place to meet, to play, to be active, and a place to enjoy the company of family, friends and neighbours, it is the heart of our community. With a strong belief that outdoor recreation is a core activity that contributes to the well-being of Lendrum residents and in response to both the community needs assessment of 2010 and Edmonton's Outdoor Aquatic Strategy, future plans for park redevelopment in Lendrum include a small spray park that will provide interactive and stimulating play as we celebrate the joys of summer. A ring trail around the playground and spray park is also planned to support active recreation for all ages. Small landscaped opportunities for unstructured play with natural materials such as boulders are also on our wish list.

The concept budget for the Spray Park Phase is just over half a million dollars. The committee will once again be seeking government grants (Edmonton Outdoor Aquatic Strategy Grant, Neighbourhood Park Development Program Grant, Community Facility Enhancement Program Grant). While we will also try to seek corporate grants, park redevelopment is largely a community-supported project and the success of the project will rely significantly on community resources. Our fundraising goal is \$175,000 and the City's Aquatic Strategy ends in 2017. How much does your household pay a month on groceries? On gas? How about at department stores and coffee shops?

FundScrip is our new fundraising initiative for park redevelopment. It is a nationwide fundraising program where supporters pay for their everyday purchases (i.e., groceries, gas, household items, restaurants, gifts) with gift cards and a percentage of the value of the gift cards purchased is then donated to Lendrum Park Redevelopment.

The percentage the project receives varies by type of card, generally 2%- 8%. This means that just by paying for your monthly groceries and gas with gift cards you can generate \$25 every month for the project – that's \$300 a year! Imagine if every household in Lendrum paid for groceries on gift cards! WOW!

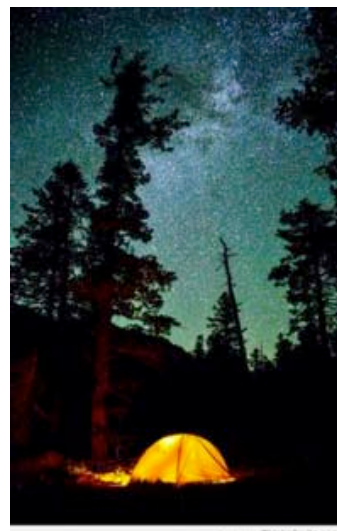
5th Annual Campout Under the Stars


