

Message from Councillor Walters

On August 19th at Transportation Committee, representatives from several neighbourhoods came to Council to speak about issues with shortcutting and speeding. This problem clearly isn't isolated to just one part of the City, but occurs in many residential areas that are bordered by busy arterial roadways.

This problem isn't new, but it has been getting more serious as neighbourhoods at the City's edges grow, with more and more people commuting into the core.

Efficiency in moving this traffic is important, and we need to have ongoing conversations about decreasing congestion on arterial roadways. But we also need to protect neighbourhoods in cases where unsafe driving behaviour is becoming the norm.

Traffic Management pilot projects like the one in Pleasantview are going to become more prevalent as communities grapple with these problems. The pilot project on 106th St and 109th St has had some success in reducing traffic to certain parts of the neighbourhood, but it has also had consequences for other parts of Pleasantview. The first full set of traffic data will be evaluated in mid-September, and Transportation will respond accordingly to the volume, behaviours, and speeds that they see in that data.

Big picture, it comes down to the choice between safety and speed of travel. The pattern tends to be that people choose and advocate for safety when in their own neighbourhood, and for speed and ease of travel in every other area. This has to change - we as residents can't expect that our neighbourhoods will be enclaves of safety if we aren't going to actively participate in creating a culture of safe driving when in other areas of Edmonton.

Civics

The University of Alberta is building a large new structure to store \$750 million in older books on the farm south of the Saville Centre. Construction starts this autumn and finishes in 2017. The university will hold an open house this autumn. The date of the open house will be announced soon.

The Capital Region Housing Corporation is considering replacing the two apartment buildings north of 60th avenue with one larger building. The project is in a conceptual stage. The Capital Region Housing Corporation would like community input. Lendrum Community Leauge is planning a meeting to discuss the proposed project on Tuesday, September 22 at 7pm at the Hall. The League wants your thoughts by email in advance of our community meeting. You can send comments to civics@lendrum.org.

Two thirds of people in northwest Lendrum signed an "expression of interest" supporting an 8am to 6pm – 2 hour parking program. Lendrum Community League submitted the signatures to the City in early July. The City responded that it wants the program expanded to the street adjacent to the hockey rink between 56 Avenue and 113A Street to simplify the program's enforcement. Canvassing on this street will begin in September.





A new concept design and budget for rehabilitating the spray deck into a spray park and for a new gazebo are expected by the end of summer.


