

Civics

In November 2015, the University Board of Governors approved farm lands that can be transferred to the new University of Alberta Property Trust. The farm lands between Grandview and Lansdowne were included in the Board's decision. The Alberta Government Cabinet now has to approve the list of lands. If Cabinet approves, the University can sign 99-year leases between itself and the University of Alberta Property Trust. The Trust can then develop the lands for profit and according to the City's planning processes. Profits of the Trust go to the University. The Trust must adhere to the Long Range Development Plan and currently has no projects under consideration. The Trust has a Board to set strategic directions but has not yet hired an Executive Director to run its operations.

The University of Alberta Dean of Physical Education announced on March 4 that the University secured funding to put a roof on Foote Field. He also announced a 2017 completion date for the project.

The City ended the new pilot Pleasantview traffic calming measures fout months after they were installed. The pilot ended several months earlier than planned. A large number of Pleasantview residents were displeased with the measures and guite vocal in their displeasure. The measures helped a small number of heavily impacted residents but were an



inconvenience to the majority of residents. The City is undertaking a study to understand how these unpopular measures got implemented.






Many thanks to all who have donated and volunteered on the park redevelopment project!

Social Events Coordinator Needed!!!



Abundant Community Initiative

What's your vision for our neighbourhood? This is a question that is being asked of Lendrum residents through the Lendrum Abundant Community Initiative. The most common answers thus far cluster around the idea of neighbourliness: "friendliness" "knowing your neighbours" and "community".

One way that we as a neighbourhood in Lendrum have been encouraging neighbourliness is through our Community Conversations initiated by our Lendrum Abundant Community Block Connectors. A blog post on "Make Something Edmonton", by project manager Mary Sturgeon, described what we are up to:

"The Abundant Community conversation is based on the belief that every individual in the neighbourhood has a contribution to make, and uncovering, sharing and the harnessing of those contributions creates neighbourliness, and also addresses issues as diverse as social isolation, crime, and physical and mental health. The notion is at the same time ridiculously commonsensical and ridiculously powerful."

Lots of people are interested in doing something tangible to create a great neighbourhood. Our plan seems to make some sense: we identify a volunteer or two on each block to initiate a casual conversation with the other households on their block. In these conversations, we learn about our neighbour's vision for the neighbourhood; their activities and interests; and the skills, gifts and experiences they might share.

Some of the good that comes of our Community Conversations include:

 A greater sense of connection and belonging within each block & within our neighbourhood as a whole (eg, welcoming new residents);

- More of our neighbourhood life can be shaped according to our own resident's vision for our neighbourhood (e.g., more parties and activities designed to connect residents);
- Linking residents to groups, those already existing & also newly formed, within the neighbourhood (e.g., hockey, gardening, historic society, biking); &
- We can better care for neighbours and the neighbourhood (e.g., snow shoveling, car pooling, meals shared in times of loss).

What we are up to in Lendrum is being done in several other Edmonton neighbourhoods too, and really is nothing new. The basis of a good neighbourhood has always been neighbours listening to one another in good conversation. We are just taking the time to make it happen.
