Message from Councillor Walters

Each year, Edmonton Transit adjusts around 10,000 service hours to ensure that all of their routes are generally compliant with the City's transit service standards. Those standards require a certain amount of ridership in order for a route to be viable.

The standard boarding requirements for ETS are:

- Weekday peak: 30 people/hour boarding
- Weekday peak in industrial areas: 20 people/ hour boarding
- Weekday off-peak: 15 people/hour boarding
- Saturdays and Sundays: 15 people/hour boarding
- Late Night and Owl Service: 15 people/hour boarding
- Community Bus Routes: 10 people/hour boarding

Each year ETS makes fairly small adjustments to routes that aren't meeting these standards. But this year is a little different. The City is facing budget pressures, and ETS didn't receive new funding for routes in the last budget. That means that ETS needs to find efficiencies within its existing operations if they want to add frequency or new service along heavily used or high demand areas.

To do this, ETS brought forward a series of service change proposals to routes that do not meet the service standards I outlined above. Some of these changes are service reductions, and some are enhancements, but all the changes will have real impacts on ETS users throughout the City. All in all, around 750 total transit trips in Ward 10 will be affected by these changes per week.

University Farm

The City and the University have signed an agreement to cooperate to build a two rink arena west of the Go Centre. Access to the arena will be from 122 Street. One rink will have a 3000 person viewing area. The other rink will be dedicated to community use. The City has been asked to contribute \$20 million to the project.

Lendrum Dog Off Leash Area

The Community League is considering five options for an off leash area in Lendrum. Please review the list of following options and send your comments to civics@lendrum.org by September 2016. A community meeting will be held in October to discuss the options. A recommendation will be made to the City in December 2016.

The City completed its "Dogs in Public Spaces Strategy" in March 2016. The City is now developing a process for community leagues to apply for off leash areas. The City will accept proposals for new off leash areas in 2017.

Option 1 (Do not have an off leash area): Currently Belgravia is the closest off leash area. It is a twenty-minute walk from the northern boundary of Lendrum.

<u>Option 2 (51st Avenue Dry Pond)</u>: The dry pond on the south-east corner of the farm has a large flat bottom. Its steep embankment is a natural barrier to traffic conflicts. The pond can serve both Lendrum and Malmo residents. One limitation is that the pond bottom could be wet for long periods.

<u>Option 3 (115 Street boulevard)</u>: The boulevard extends the length of Lendrum and thus provides the best access for the majority of Lendrumites. The area is currently serviced by two cans for dog waste that are regularly serviced. This area is already heavily used by dog owners in Lendrum and Malmo. It is adjacent to a street with speed controls and so reduces conflict with traffic. Option 4 (60th Street Dry Pond): The dry pond to the north of Lendrum has a large flat open area. The area is fenced and is unlikely to cause conflicts with other users. The area might be hard to access for city trucks managing dog waste. The area might be wet for long periods of the year.

Option 5 (111th Street / LRT Tunnel): There is a green space to the north of Lendrum and southwest of the LRT tunnel. This space includes an area the City is trying to "naturalize" to create habitat for wildlife. It also has a bike path. The naturalized area and bike path are likely not good fits with an off leash area.

Criteria for choosing an off leash area:

- Reduce current unauthorized off leash activity in areas like school yards and the university farm.
- Minimizes potential conflict between pedestrians and safety issues for children.
- Minimizes traffic and parking activity if people drive to the area.
- Maximizes the ability of Lendrum dog owners to get to and use the area. Benefits include meeting neighbours and socializing dogs. It also reduces traffic in the city because people do not drive to off leash areas.


School grounds revitalization


Park Redevelopment

Lots of exciting news and happenings on the spray project! Recently we were successful in obtaining a Community Facility Enhancement Program Grant for \$125,000. Last weekend about 160 Lendrumites came out to St. John's to visit with friends and neighbours, support the project and bid on lots of great items and services from our amazing donors. Many thanks to all who came out and who donated including Geoff Scott who donated his 50/50 winnings. The evening brought in more than \$8000 for the spray park meaning the project is now 98% funded and leaving just over \$10,000 remaining to be fundraised by year end. 

Green & Gold Community Garden A local garden with global impact

The volunteer gardeners at the Green & Gold Community garden, on the University of Alberta South Campus, are making plans for our eighth gardening season! The garden, an initiative of the University's Faculty of Agricultural, Life and Environmental Sciences, is totally volunteer run. Virtually all of the seeds, plants and equipment used are donated.

The vegetables, herbs and flowers are "spray-free" (no pesticides or artificial fertilizers are used). Anyone is welcome to 'purchase' their vegetables at the garden and all of the money raised – that's 100% – goes to the **Tubahumurize Association**, a non-profit organization in Rwanda that provides socially and economically marginalized women with vocational training, counselling, life-skills coaching, health care education, and opportunities for sustainable income generating activities. Most individuals who benefit from Tubahumurize are genocide survivors and many are widows or orphans, HIV infected, and survivors of physical and sexual violence. To date, the garden has raised over \$100,000 for the Tubahumurize project.

We are now gearing up for the 2016 gardening season, and are looking for new volunteers to join us at the garden. Both novice & experienced gardeners are welcome. 

To jumpstart this, Block Connectors use a "Neighbour Conversation Guide" to record the information and answers they find out from their neighbours. The idea is that we can then start to connect neighbours on the basis of the actual interests and abilities of people in the community.

We're also hoping to get Block Party's happening on as many blocks in Lendrum as we can this spring/summer/fall. If you'd like to learn how to get one off the ground we'd love to help! And just recently the City of Edmonton eliminated the fee to block off roads for block parties!
