# **Community News**

### **Community Meeting**

Capital Regional Housing Corporation has been working with a panel of advisors, including Lendrum community members, to redevelop their existing site on 60th Ave. A community meeting on the redevelopment will be held on **Wednesday**, **October 12 from 5-8pm location TBD**. # **Redevelopment of Park North Entrance**

You may have noticed some construction taking place on the north entrance to the park. The city has funded the replacement of the stairs with an accessible pathway. Now the entrance will be accessible to strollers, bikes, wheelchairs and wagons! The contruction is scheduled to take two weeks, weather permitting.

# **Civics**

### Bus #55 Service Reduction

Starting September 1, the City reduced 55 bus service to weekday peak hours. The City made the decision because less than eight people an hour take the bus in off peak hours. Thirty other city bus routes now have reduced service or were cancelled. Lendrum residents can use the 33, 34, 9 or LRT routes as an alternative to the 55. DATS is also an alternative. Please email civics@lendrum.org or contact the City if you have concerns regarding the reduction in service.

### University Farm Coyote Warning

The University of Alberta reminds dog owners that coyotes frequent the farm. Dogs off leash have been attacked recently. Please follow the farm's rules which are signed. Keep to grassed paths, don't disturb crops and keep your dogs leashed.

## Dog Park

In the last newsletter four potential options for an off leash area in Lendrum were suggested.

Ten families voiced their opinion on a potential off leash park in Lendrum. Three families support a park in the 51st street dry pond. Three support the 60th street dry pond. One supports a park near the LRT tunnel and one supports the 115th street boulevard. Two people expressed general support for a dog park. No one was in opposition to an off leash area. Many people want a fence to keep dogs safe.

The City might ask the community to fund a fence if the City accepts the idea of a park. The City will also ask the Lendrum residents to establish a volunteer group to support maintenance of the park.

# **Park Redevelopment**

Many thanks to all who volunteered and donated to summer fundraising events. The bottle drive, garage sale, book sale, Canada Day BBQ and Summer Campout together brought in almost \$5,000 for the spray park project.

We have one more bottle drive for the spray park – Saturday, October 15. If you have a couple of hours to donate either that day or before delivering flyers please contact Julie at juliemoehler@gmail. com.

The committee has narrowed down the choices for our new shade shelter and will soon be starting to pick spray features. Construction is slated to begin in Spring 2017 once the weather warms up and should be finished in time to have some play time in the summer.

The City has increased the project cost from \$511,250 to \$529,250.00. We will continue to






With school starting again this fall, be prepared to follow the posted speed limits.
