Rezoning of Korean Church

The church located in Malmo at 51st Avenue and 111 Street as well as its adjacent lots to the west was recently rezoned to allow the church to expand and construct a sign. The site was previously zoned RF1 - Single Detached Residential - and was rezoned to US - Urban Services. US zoning is used for schools and churches.

Infill Presentation ... Maybe

The City might give a presentation to Lendrum residents on the subdivision process and construction practices. The date is yet to be set and will likely be after the election. Within Lendrum, a lot subdivision occurred on 113A Street in 2016 and a second subdivision occurred in 2017 on 56 Avenue.

Farm Land Title

The South Campus Neighbourhood Coalition

is a joint partnership of Lendrum and other communities around the university farm. The Coalition provides input to the university regarding the farm's development. Park Redevelopment

The project is several weeks delayed but construction work is now underway. The project contract was awarded to Aspen Pride contracting. Spray decks typically take 8-12 weeks so much of it will (hopefully) be done in the fall and some will have to be finished in the early spring with the fencing remaining over the winter.

The delay has largely been due to the City's change in process for awarding bids, which has delayed

all park projects.

Due to the project bids coming in approximately \$50,000 over the city's estimated amounts we are continuing our fundraising efforts with another bottle drive on Saturday, Oct 14. Turkey Trot



Who's Who (in the LCL)

At our strategic planning session, it was suggested that we share a bit more information about the various roles in the LCL (Lendrum Community League) and the people who currently fill them. This will be a new regular feature in Lendrum Living. This issue we will learn about Stephen, our civics representative.

1. Name: Stephen Dobson

2. What is your role?

Lendrum Civics Representative - I work with the City and other levels of government on projects of interest to the League, usually in relation to zoning, bylaws, traffic, and transportation. I am also chair of the South Campus Neighbourhood Coalition as an extension of the civics role and member of the UofA Community Consultation group (which meets irregularly) and the Central Area Community Leagues group (which doesn't seem to meet anymore).

3. How long have you been doing this role?

I have been the Lendrum Civics representative for three years, since May 2014.

4. How long have you lived in Lendrum?

I have lived in Lendrum since 2008. I also attended Saint John's Anglican Church from 1975 to 1981 and went to Scouts there at about the same time. I lived in Lansdowne from 1971 to 1991 and in Parkallen, Garneau and Allendale since 1991 and so am very familiar with the area. I went to Lansdowne Elementary, Grandview Junior High, Harry Ainlay High School and the UofA. I work for the provincial government.

5. Why did you take on this position?

To contribute to the community given the support community leagues have given my family. My daughter went to girl guides in the Lendrum community hall for 4 or 5 years. She went to soccer and guides in several other community leagues as well.

6. How much time does this position take?

This position can take a much time as a person likes. I am trying to keep the position to a minimum now. Say 60 hours a year.

7. What do you like about this role?

I have a greater understanding of the issues in the community and in the city. It is interesting meeting our city councillor and MLA occasionally. It is also interesting to see how zoning rules are applied.

INTERESTED IN AN EV (ELECTRIC VEHICLE)?

COMPARE WITH GAS



The typical modern car is not efficient, it is only 25% to 30% thermally efficient in ideal conditions. For a specific example, let's consider the Prius, not your typical car, actually much more efficient. Even a third generation Prius is 38.5% thermally efficient: this means 61.5% energy is wasted as heat.

The typical energy split in gasoline internal combustion engines is as such: 25% effective power for mobility and accessories, 5% loss in friction and parasitic losses, 30% to coolant, and 40% in exhaust gas. Burning fossil fuels creates emissions: CO2, N2O, SO2, and particulate matter.

Regular gas and diesel vehicles have a narrow RPM range which necessitates complicated transmissions. They are inherently noisy with lots of vibration.

Electric drive offers very high energy efficiency - 80% to 95%. There are zero tailpipe emissions. An EV has the potential to be pollution free.

EVs have very quiet operation with almost no vibration. They have a very wide efficient RPM range, and full torque at 0 rpm means no transmission is needed. Electric motors have one moving part, and require almost no maintenance. They cost much less to operate compared to a gas car.

The current charging technology is slow compared to a gas fill-up, and the charging infrastructure is not yet widespread - also compared to gas station infrastructure. However both these things continue to to advance in favour of electric vehicles. Also changing is battery technology, meaning the limited range of an EV is evolving.

EVs are currently not practical for large, long range, heavy haul vehicles. We definitely still need oil and gas. The question is, why are we wasting it on the typical car?

Electric motors will happily accept power from any source. This does mean that electric vehicles are only as clean as their source of electricity, which is something to consider in Alberta. (The local emissions intensity in AB is approximately 60X that of BC, due to the huge amount of coal burnt in AB for electrical needs.). Can we change this in our own backyard? Yes we can! Next newsletter we will look at how to have a nearly pollution-free EV, and compare different models with typical gas-run cars.

Lendrum's Pottery Group

Did you know that a pottery group runs out of the north end of the Lendrum Community Hall? Here is a brief history of the group. To view their work, check out one of their two annual sales. For more information about the pottery group, contact Joy Schlaut at 780-434-1997.

January 1970 marked the beginning of the Lendrum Pottery Group. Instructor Pat Galbraith obtained a grant to cover the groups' costs. Community League members gathered in the changeroom of the Lendrum Hall to learn pottery.

Working on their laps with cloth covered plywood and rolling pins from home, instruction began with simple hand building techniques and progressed over time.

A kiln for clay firing was available at the Duggan Health Centre. The group was able to use the kiln with the understanding that they would accept Health Centre clients as members when requested.

Back at Community League Hall, the bisqued pieces were painted with purchased low fire glazes and were taken back to Health Centre for repeat firing procedure. This routine carried on for two years.

In 1972 the Pottery Group bought its first kiln, which was housed in the main room of the Community Hall. This kiln was capable of medium temperature firing making it safe for cookware. There was no instructor so members used books for inspiration and guidance. Over the years the Group brought in paid renowned Edmonton potters such as Linda Buhlman, Betty Schultz, Peggy Heer and Jackie Lemieux for instruction.

In 1973 we purchased our first wheel built by Edmontonian Chuck Bryan (this wheel is still in use today). At this time there were 3 change rooms in the Hall. The central large change room became the first designated pottery room. It was also in 1973 that the group started to make their own glazes.

From 1976-1978, Betty Anne Stromsmoe ran pottery classes for children. The Community League helped the Pottery Group out at this time by constructing a small, enclosed space for the kiln and had three well designed cupboards built to hold pottery pieces.

In 1985 the Pottery Group bought their 2nd kiln.

During **1992** and**1993** the Community Hall underwent renovations. The Pottery Group moved to its present location on the north side of the building, which had previously been a second change room. During the renovation our kiln was damaged. The Group purchased our 3rd kiln in **March1993**.

In **1995**, the Pottery Group bought its 2nd wheel (still in use). It is completely automated, which allows people with disabilities to throw on a wheel.

In **1996**, the Pottery Group purchased an extruder (still in use). In **1998**, the Pottery Group bought a slab roller (still in use)

In 1999, the Pottery Group performed its first Raku firing with a homemade gas kiln. Glazes have a metallic look and these pieces are strictly decorative. At this time the shed was built and the Pottery Group was given much needed space to store its Raku equipment and pottery sale signs. This was also the year of our first large pottery sale in the Community Hall. Since the inaugural sale, the group has held two sales a year.

In 2011, the Pottery Group bought its 4th kiln.

Pottery Group Today

Our membership currently sits at 10 to 12 persons with preference given to Lendrum Community members and existing Pottery Group members.

Over the years the Lendrum Pottery Group has been self-sufficient - having public pottery sales, and charging registration fees and clay costs to members. We have purchased all our equipment and pay for our own repairs and supplies. Since 1972 we have paid \$10 per kiln load to the Community League and since 1993 we have shared 10% of our registration fees with the League.

On behalf of the Lendrum Pottery Group we would like to say thank you to Lendrum Community and its League executives over the years for giving us their support and space to pot.
