Message from Councillor Walters

KEEPING OUR WASTE MANAGEMENT STRATEGY BOLD

Edmonton has always prided itself in being a leader in waste management and we treat waste as a valuable resource, with more than 50 percent of household waste being diverted from the landfill. We are continually researching new technologies and processes to improve our operations to conserve natural resources, reduce greenhouse gas production and create additional revenue from compost, recyclables, and biofuels.

Recently, the Edmonton Waste Services Audit was released and unfortunately, the news is not good. It revealed problems with current operations and prompted discussion of a new strategy for Edmonton's waste management system. However, improving Edmonton's residential waste diversion will depend on the use of innovative technology, operational changes, and continued participation from all Edmontonians.

One thing you can do to help in the meantime is to go bagless in the summer. Nearly half of all waste collected from Edmonton households in the summer is grass – almost 50,000 tonnes – and this needs to be trucked far away for composting. Going bagless has proven to be healthier for lawns by preserving moisture and nutrients while also being better for the environment.

Waste services and operations is currently exploring options for altering curbside collection pick up schedules for grass clippings and yard waste by September. The City is also preparing to engage citizens in source separation, which means having separate collections of food scraps and organics. In Canada, 40 percent - or \$31 billion - of all food produced is thrown out, globally this is \$990 Billion USD. While reducing waste is ideal, composting creates valuable, nutrient-rich soil. Source separation will also result in higher quality, more marketable compost and leave drier, more usable material for our Biofuels facility. Neither of these programs are final, and we are discussing this until the report comes to Council in June.

In addition, I am committed to working with the private sector to improve our commercial and institutional waste management programs. By decentralizing composting facilities into smaller community composters, exploring local processing of recycled material, and reevaluating how we work and serve commercial businesses, we can improve efficiency and help get private waste haulers to collect into our diversion stream.

We must not lose our nerve because of past setbacks. This new phase of waste management will take some time to implement and get used to, but I know if we continue to work with the public and our stakeholders, we will be able to reach our original target of diverting 90 percent of waste out of our landfills, creating a cleaner, healthier and more sustainable city for future generations.

Civics

Alberta Infrastructure and Alberta Health Services Open House

Alberta Infrastructure and Alberta Health Services plan to have an open house in September on the new 800-employee laboratory to be built north of the school for the deaf. The lab will centralize laboratory services for all Edmonton in one place. The site will likely be fenced off for construction in November 2018. The current plan is to have a parking lot built east of the LRT station. The land is owned by the University and is current allocated to student housing. The proposed parking lot will likely require a change the the South Campus Long Range Development plan and thus community consultation. The University has not yet agreed to the parking lot. Lab workers work staggered hours and thus traffic impacts will be moderate. Alberta Infrastructure will commission a traffic study.

Capital Regional Housing Authority Rezoning Application

The Capital Region Housing Authority applied to the City to rezone the area north of 60th avenue to allow the building of a 126 unit apartment building. The building will replace the existing 48 units in two buildings currently on the site. The City Planning department supports the rezoning. City Council will vote on Bylaw 18324 to rezone the area on March 19th. The City held an open house for residents on January 23 and heard the following concerns: there is a potential for traffic shortcutting through Lendrum; there might be safety concerns at pedestrian crossings; and, the impact of densification is unknown.

The volunteer gardeners at the Green & Gold Community garden, on the University of Alberta South Campus, are making plans for our *tenth* gardening season! The garden is a project of the University's Faculty of Agricultural, Life and Environmental Sciences. The garden is totally volunteer run; virtually all of the seeds, plants and equipment used are donated.

The vegetables, fruit, herbs and flowers are "spray-free" --no pesticides or artificial fertilizers are used. The general public is welcome to purchase their vegetables at the garden and all of the money raised - that's 100% - goes to the **Tubahumurize Association**. A non-profit organization in Rwanda, it supports and empowers female victims of violence and marginalization through trauma counselling, life-skills coaching vocational training, andmicro-credit loans. Many women who benefit from Tubahumurize are genocide survivors, widows, orphans, HIV infected, or survivors of physical and sexual violence. To date, the garden has raised over \$290,000 for Tubahumurize.

City Council will hold a Public Hearing to consider the proposed Bylaw 18324: Rezone Lot 1A, Block 18, Plan 1024711, from (RA7) Low Rise Apartment Zone, to (DC2) Site Specific Development Control Provision. This will allow for the redevelopment of this site with 2 new apartment buildings, each a maximum of 6 storeys in height, providing for a maximum of 126 residential units on the site. This could also allow for small, neighbourhood-serving commercial uses including a daycare and cafe.
