
Sunday, June 24, 12-4pm

Message from Councillor Walters

In December, the Government of Alberta announced the development of a new \$325 million Superlab at the University lands by South Campus/Fort Edmonton Park LRT station. Construction is scheduled to start in 2019 and the current proposal for the superlab includes a surface parking lot for its employees right next to the South Campus LRT Station.

I'm certain that a parking lot is not the best and highest use of this land. Building a parking lot at this location would not be a park and ride for LRT users and it would not necessarily be used for overflow parking for residents of the neighbouring communities. This will not alleviate the issues with parasitic parking in the surrounding communities.

I do not support building a parking lot so close to an LRT station. It flies in the face of good urban planning. Of course, there will still be a need for parking at this site - with around 800 employees not all of them will be able or willing to take public transportation. However, I don't see why they would choose the land right beside the LRT station for this proposed parking lot.

There needs to be some thought put into how to effectively use our existing transportation network and the limited space we have available. For example, there is the potential to build student housing on this land right beside the LRT while moving the parking lot to the land North or South of this location. This would become an attractive place for any student to live with easy access to the University and the rest of the city. Building a parking lot at this location would be incongruent with our commitment to building an attractive LRT system.

The City has limited capacity to affect the development of this land, as it is regulated by the province and the University. However, I will ensure we work with the province and start the conversation to make it clear that this land, which is right beside an LRT station, can and should be used in a way that takes modern urban planning principles into account. I would also like to thank the Lendrum Community League for passing a motion saying that it also does not support building a super lab parking lot next to the LRT.

We will be getting a report back on my motion on June 7, 2018 at Executive committee with information on how we can collaborate with the province to ensure this land takes into account all stakeholders and uses the land to its highest and best use.

Civics

60th Street Apartment Building

The City approved the rezoning of the land north of 60th Street. The Capital Regional Housing Corporation can now build a 6-storey building on the site that currently has two 3-storey apartment buildings. The City felt the 6-storey building was appropriate for a site close to an LRT station. The Mayor said that the building is consistent with transit-oriented development and that the project is good even if it is not as large as other developments in the area of LRT stations.

Alberta Health Services Laboratory Building Near the LRT Station

The proposed laboratory to be built next to the LRT station will have a large parkade. The Lendrum League Board passed a motion at the May 7th Board meeting agreeing to send a letter to Alberta Health Services saying the Board does not support the construction of the parkade. The Board said the parkade contradicts transit oriented development and displaces potential student housing that might be built on the site. The government has not decided where parking will be located. There will be 0.5 lots per worker which is lower than the typical 0.7 lots per worker. Alberta Health Services will hold an open house in October but the date has not been set.

Major Transit Changes Proposed

The City is proposing major changes to transit throughout Edmonton. The proposal is designed to increase the frequency of transit and make peripheral travel easier. Three systems are proposed. First a system of frequent-interval buses on major corridors typically going downtown. The 9 bus is such a route but it will be renamed. Second a set of frequent-interval buses moving peripherally

around the city to complement the downtown buses. Third, a series of community-oriented buses collecting people to go to frequent-interval buses. Community-oriented buses do not go through the center of communities. The buses run adjacent to the community. In all communities of

Edmonton people will need to walk to the edge of their community to get transit.

LRT and Pedestrian Crossing Safety

The City says that all signaling at LRT road and pedestrian crossings are regularly checked to assure signs work properly. All signals must meet federal rail-crossing standards. Nonetheless, Parkallen Community League is meeting this May with City officials about the potential benefit of additional measures. A representative from Lendrum will attend the meeting.



Lendrum Hall Rentals - Changes are Coming July 1, 2018

Lendrum Hall is busier than ever. During 2017 there were 102 single-event rentals as well as many programs that repeated regularly. For the first time, more rentals were booked by folks who live outside Lendrum (65 non-residents and 37 residents). Income from rentals more than doubled from 2016, from around \$4600 to \$11000.

Of course, the playground, volleyball courts, ice rink and glowing green sports fields attract many renters. Our central location appeals to many residents of the new suburbs who don't yet have their own halls. In addition, Lendrum hall has had the lowest rent among halls in southwest Edmonton (\$25/h or \$100/day for residents and slightly higher for non residents). Perhaps another factor has been that folks could rent the hall without a contract, damage deposit, or proof of insurance.

When most of our renters were our neighbours there was no need for formal contracts. Renters left the hall as clean as they found it and rarely cancelled a booking last minute. In the last eight months, although most renters have acted responsibly, there has been an increased number of cancellations and a few renters have left the hall absolutely filthy.

Without a contract and deposit, our board and the hall rental coordinator have had no power to do anything about these problems. For these reasons, starting July 1 2018, folks who want to rent Lendrum Hall will have to pay a deposit to hold their booking, complete a contract, agree to a cancellation policy, and purchase special event insurance if they plan to serve alcohol. The hall will be inspected before and after each event. Lendrum residents with community league memberships will be able to rent the hall Sunday afternoon or evening for \$50 or any other time for \$25/h.
