Message from Councillor Walters

Happy New Year Lendrum, I hope the holidays and start of 2019 have treated all of you well.

Council has hit the ground running since returning from the holiday recess. On January 15th the Urban Planning Committee discussed the First Kilometre/Last Kilometre report. This report was developed to address the reduction in community bus service as a result of the Bus Network Redesign (BNR) set for 2020. First Kilometre/Last Kilometre addresses how people travel for the first and last kilometres of their daily commutes.

As part of the BNR, Administration has proposed replacing Lendrum's Route 55 bus with a more frequent but shorter route service. This new bus would link Lendrum with Malmo Plains and Southgate. It would run every 30 minutes from 6:00am-6:00pm on weekdays and 8:00am-8:00pm on weekends. The entire route is estimated to take around 15-20 minutes. I have requested a more detailed breakdown of the bus route, and I will continue to advocate for the interests of Lendrum residents in the BNR. I will share updates about anticipated changes to Lendrum's bus service with your community as I receive them.

Snow and ice management remain top of mind with many Edmontonians concerned about unclear rules for when snow must be removed. Current City guidelines dictate a 48 hour grace period after a snowfall with exceptions for businesses, chronic offenders, or in exceptional circumstances such as consecutive days of snowfall or ice-covered sidewalks.

Lendrum offers a free of charge community sandbox for all residents to use on their sidewalks. If you have a concern about snow removal or if your community sandbox is empty, you can call 311 for assistance. If you are a senior in need of help with snow removal, you can find low-cost, pre-screened options with this link: https://www.edmonton.ca/programs_services/for_seniors/help-around-the-home.aspx.

The City has upgraded the safety features at the 60th Avenue LRT crossing in response to the tragic death of an Edmontonian there in October 2017. Signalling has been improved at the crossing and mechanical arms have been installed. While these improvements can never bring back the life that was lost, they greatly reduce the risk of such an accident ever recurring. As your City Councillor, I will continue to look diligently into ways we can make Edmonton public transit safer for everyone.

Come play soccer with Lendrum Community this season!

Outdoor soccer is affordable, fun, and a great way for your child to meet other children in your community. Outdoor Soccer begins the 1st week of May (weather permitting) and ends late June, except for teams proceeding to post season play (U13-U19) who may play into July & August.


