Come Join Us At The Annual Lendrum Summer BBQ!


Sunday June 23, 12 - 4 PM

Message from Councillor Walters

Hello Lendrum! As always, it's my pleasure to provide your community with some updates from City Hall. Earlier this spring, my office conducted research on 311 data to get a better picture of the key concerns in Ward 10. The biggest issue in Lendrum was Snow and Ice Maintenance, so having this information means my office will be able to work proactively on the key concerns in our Ward.

In the winter edition of the Lendrum community newsletter, I provided an update about the status of the Route 55. This bus looks like it will be replaced as part of the Bus Network Redesign set for July 2020. The new bus would be more frequent and follow a shorter route linking Lendrum and Malmo to Southgate. The bus will operate with 30-minute frequency 6:00 am to 6:00 pm on weekdays and 8:00 am to 7:00 pm on Saturdays. I have attached an image of the proposed route, subject to some final tweaks.

Crime has risen in Edmonton's southwest, and while we are in better shape than other parts of the city, this rise is unacceptable. On May 25th I held a Ward 10 Community League Presidents' Crime Reduction breakfast. I was happy to have Police Chief McFee and Southwest Police Superintendent Pallas present alongside other law enforcement officials. I am currently working with REACH Edmonton and Southgate Mall to reduce crime around the mall and transit centre. Finally, my office is keeping up to date with the Inter-Neighbourhood Security Task Force, a group of mostly Ward 10 communities working to reduce crime in their communities.

On May 14th City Council passed a motion requesting that Administration come back in early 2020 with a bylaw that would change speed limits on residential roads in the core to 30km/h and 40km/h outside of the core. Coming to a final decision on speed limits will require a lot more information from the cost of signage to potential issues with speed limit complexity.

Civics

On May 14th, City Council passed a interim motion to make the default speed on local roads 40 km/h. Speed limits for the local roads in the city core limits will be lower. Lendrum is not in the city core.

Council wants the City administration to further consult the public before a final vote is held in 2020.

On May 7th the City's Urban Planning Committee voted to advance the implementation of an "open parking requirement" for new residential and business sites. An "open parking requirement" means that developers can decide how much on site parking is needed. The Committee considered 3 alternatives: minimum, open, or maximum parking requirement rules.

This year, the Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues (EFCL) will re-negotiate the tripartite agreement with the City. The tripartite agreement are the rules that say how a community league can use its hall. Lendrum League is going to ask the EFCL to provide education about how the agreement impacts the use of Lendrum hall.

The City undertook a consultation in March and April regarding the City Plan which is a vision of how Edmonton should look in 40 years. The plan will inform changes to the zoning bylaw. Zoning bylaws say what types of buildings can be built in specific locations. The City administration will report to council in September on the results of the consultation.

The Capital Region Housing Authority plans to demolish the apartments on 60th Avenue in July 2019. Construction will start in November 2019. A six storey apartment building will be built. Lendrum residents were extensively consulted on the design of the building.

The construction of the Alberta Health Services laboratory north of the school for the deaf has stopped. The new government has not yet decided whether to continue construction or not. They are considering their options. Alberta Health Services will inform Lendrum when the decision is made.

We are still looking for additional volunteers for the BBQ and the beer gardens. Please contact Lance at adamson@telus.net if you would like to volunteer.


The race course is a closed loop and no cars will be allowed on the course. Residents whose homes are on the course will have access to their homes through the alley.

Another school year is almost over. And again it was a great year for Avalon students and staff.
